The Lessons and Liturgy Today

Jesus used five loaves of bread and two fish to feed 5,000 families. This was enough for all, with twelve baskets of fragments left over! His followers had assumed that this would not be enough; they had not realized what He could do if they only turned their resources over to Him. This miracle is a tangible reminder of the free gift of Eternal Life that comes anew through Word and Sacrament each time we worship. The Apostle Paul lamented that many of his fellow Jews did not know about the blessings God offers through Christ. Each time we come to the Lord's Supper, we receive the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

PRELUDE

WELCOME

GREETING OF PEACE

All are invited to greet one another in the name of the Lord, saying, "Peace be with you," as a sign of reconciliation and of the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. (Matt. 5:22–24; Eph. 4:1–3) Any gesture accompanying this greeting (wave, hand over heart with slight bow, or handshake) is welcome.

❖ INVOCATION

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

- A for His Steadfast Love endures forever. (Psalm 136:25, 1)

♦ CONFESSION OF SINS AND GOOD NEWS OF FORGIVENESS

Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.

- P God calls us to rely on Him for all we need to support this body and life, all that we call "daily bread." And He offers it "without money and without price." (Isaiab 55:1)
- A We confess that we have relied more on our own logic and planning; and, in our worrying, have not taken God at His Word.
- P Our Heavenly Father offers more than physical food: He freely extends to us the Eternal Covenant He made with Abraham and with David. (Romans 9:8) (Isaiah 55:5) It was signed and sealed in Jesus, the Son of God. We have been united with God's people of all time in His Kingdom.
- A We confess that too often we have counted on our own good deeds and religious knowledge to ensure our entrance into the Heavenly Banquet Hall.
- P Our Lord would have us extend the Kingdom as we meet the needs of the people around us; as He told His disciples to feed the thousands with the bread and fish He would multiply. (Matthew 14:16)
- A We confess that, at times, we have been content to find peace in our own salvation and have not translated our faith into loving action using God's Gifts for the good of others and the spread of the Gospel.
- P Give thanks to the LORD, for He is Good, for His Steadfast Love endures forever. Our Lord's once-for-all sacrifice on the cross and His glorious resurrection has not only opened Heaven to us; but has covered our sins of weak faith, pride in ourselves, and failure to see the opportunities for ministry around us. (Psalm 136:1)

- P Therefore, as a Called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His Authority, I forgive you all your sins in the Name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the Holy Spirit. Come and be nourished on the bounty of God's Word and Sacraments.
- A Amen. Thanks be to God!

EPISTLE READING

Romans 9:1-13

(God's promises are for all whom He calls.)

I speak the truth in Christ--I am not lying, my conscience confirms it in the Holy Spirit-- I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart.

For I could wish that I myself were cursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my

brothers, those of my own race, the people of Israel.

Theirs is the adoption as sons; theirs the Divine Glory, the covenants, the receiving of the Law, the temple worship and the promises. Theirs are the patriarchs, and from them is traced the human ancestry of Christ, Who is God over all, forever praised! Amen.

It is not as though God's word had failed. For not all who are descended from Israel are Israel.

Nor because they are his descendants are they all Abraham's children.

On the contrary, "It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned." In other words, it is not the natural children who are God's Children, but it is the children of the promise who are regarded as Abraham's offspring.

A This is the Word of the Lord.

A Thanks be to God.

For this was how the promise was stated: "At the appointed time I will return, and Sarah will have a son."

Not only that, but Rebekah's children had one and the same father, our father Isaac. Yet, before the twins were born or had done anything good or bad—in order that God's Purpose in election might stand: not by works but by Him Who calls—she was told,

"The older will serve the younger."
Just as it is written:

"Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated."

Hearing of this, the crowds followed Him on foot from the towns.

"This is a remote place and it's already

"This is a remote place, and it's already getting late.

Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food."

Jesus replied,
"They do not need to go away.
You give them something to eat."
"We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered.
"Bring them here to Me," He said.
And He directed the people to sit down on the grass.

Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to Heaven, He gave thanks and broke the loaves.

Then He gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people.

They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.

The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.
