



## Council Corner - April 2020 Meeting

We opened our meeting with a devotion based on the 1<sup>st</sup> Chapter of Ephesians. This passage, especially verses 9-10, were a good reinforcement of the Easter message. In all things, the health and safety of our members is our top priority, along with the ability to continue to bring the Word through various media platforms. We are so grateful for the contribution of those church members who have voluntarily given of their time to videotape and edit the worship content.

- 1. March receipts (\$93,000) were down about 20% from a typical 5 Sunday month and possibly reflect the impact of the Covid-19 situation. The average weekly giving rate of \$18,500 vs. our weekly budgeted amount of \$25,100 is a major concern. Our expenses were on par with normal expenditures. YTD we are now running at a negative (\$35,000). We greatly appreciate the contributions of all our members. We are going to be emphasizing the importance of giving, as members are able, during this time. To help keep everyone updated on our giving, we are going back to publishing weekly giving totals in the Announcements.
- 2. With the Church, RLS, and RLP all being under one tax number, we filed our application for the Payroll Protection Program (PPP). With the dedication of the financial personnel of the three organizations, we were able to submit our application on the first day our bank, SunTrust, was accepting documents. The financials of our application include salaries and medical/retirement benefits. Our monthly total for these areas is \$138,482. Based on the 2.5 factor, our application totaled \$346,200. To date, we have not received notice of loan approval. There is no loan payment for 6 months and, after two months, we can apply for loan forgiveness. The condition for loan forgiveness requires 75% of the loan be used for actual salaries over 2 months.
- 3. Our initial financial analysis indicates that if we can improve our giving somewhat and obtain the PPP loan, we should be in a more manageable position.
- 4. Presently, we can't currently, with any degree of confidence, predict our income until we return to a normal two-month pattern. Given this condition, the Council has endorsed waiting until we have more reliable data to complete our budget and submit it for Congregational Vote. Our target date is early to mid-3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2020.
- 5. Pastor Jonathan reported that current viewership of our Sunday services averages about 600 "views", which includes cases where 1 view is a group/family. Our typical Sunday morning worship attendance prior to the shutdown and move to recording worship content was averaging around 500.
- 6. The current assessment is that going forward it will be impossible from a manpower and timing perspective to pre-produce worship and provide 3 or more in person worship services. To help us learn more about the value of "live streaming", and how it fits as part of our regular services, an Assessment Team has been formed. Team objectives are being finalized.
- 7. Council approved the RLS Endowment Request for supporting the RLS Junior Kindergarten program. This request should have been part of our normal Fall Endowment reviews.
- 8. A draft of the proposed By Law language to change the term limit of Council members from 2 to 3 years was reviewed. A couple minor language changes were proposed. In addition, the current language has no limitations as to how many consecutive terms a Council person can serve. A 2-term consecutive provision is being added to the proposed change that will be submitted for approval at the next Voter's Meeting.
- 9. The Council reviewed the draft Action Plans for the top three Strategic Goals, including hiring an Associate Pastor, 'One Church', and improving our Adult and Youth Sunday School attendance.
  - With the goal of having an Associate Pastor on board no later than mid-2021, we reviewed timing options for a Seminary Graduate or Current Pastor. To support this program, we are targeting a Spring 2021 Stewardship campaign.
  - We identified several new programs to support our objective of building our small group ministry. The "live streaming" evaluation will also be key for the development of the concept that we are all part of 'One Church'. We will continue to develop more all-church wide events.
  - We discussed several ways to help us better understand the relationship between youth and parents both attending Sunday School. A survey of current and potential families is being considered.
     Understanding the impact any possible Service Change will have on members/families attending Sunday School will also be important.


