

Dear Family and Friends of Resurrection Lutheran Church,

Greetings to each and every one of you as we bask in the enduring light of this Easter season. Alleluia, Christ is risen! (He is risen indeed! Alleluia!)

Now that our congregational survey results have come in and Governor Cooper has announced the latest in the phased approach to reopening in our state, allow me to note the following:

- 1) Half (321) of those receiving the church survey invitations (640 households) responded.
- 2) A high number of RLC survey respondents (18%) indicated the impossibility of returning to in-person worship at this time, even with proper social distancing protocols in place.
- 3) A high number of survey respondents gave positive feedback about the worship content currently being made available for remote viewing and would like to see it continue.
- 4) A relatively high number of survey respondents (67%) indicated an openness to worship in the church parking lot (assuming worship in the church sanctuary was not possible).
- 5) Though the state is now allowing church worship to go forward inside church buildings, proper measures being required for such in-person worship considerably complicates matters (see below);
- We have received information from our church body regarding possible risks associated with singing inside of worship spaces (<u>https://bit.ly/3d7Wdv7</u>)

At Resurrection, we will therefore deploy the following:

- 1) Transition from pre-produced worship content to a weekly worship live stream, held every Sunday in the main sanctuary, starting at 9 AM and beginning May 31;
- 2) Offer a weekly opportunity for in-person worship in the church parking lot, beginning June 7, at 10:30 AM;
- Continue to make in-person reception of Holy Communion available to families or small groups of 9 or fewer in the church sanctuary every Sunday from 1–5 PM, beginning May 31 (use the sign-up genius to register www.signupgenius.com/go/10C0D4DABAE2EABFF2-holy);
- 4) Continually assess the quality of worship being offered and determine if greater accessibility to in-person worship inside the church building might be feasible. At this time (5/22), per guidelines from local government about gathering inside, anything resembling a safe environment for in-person worship would require temperature checks at the door, use of face masks by worshipers, usher-directed flow of traffic inside the building, social distancing of six feet between families of worshipers, no physical contact between worshipers, enhanced care exercised in the reception of the Lord's Supper, no use of wind instruments, and no singing by congregants.

Our hearts yearn to be together in person. The day will soon come when that will be possible! In the meantime, please avail yourself of these opportunities for corporate worship and keep all of us in your prayers as we seek to serve you.



Life For Uganda Update

Covid-19 continues to rule over our routines and our best laid plans and because of this, the mission team which was scheduled to travel to Uganda this year will not be able to make the journey. Travel restrictions will remain in place in both the US and Uganda for the foreseeable future, therefore Life For Uganda is working with the Lutheran Church of Uganda (LCU) to reschedule in 2021. While we're disappointed, we're also finding ways to support the LCU in their extensive Covid-19 relief efforts. Food insecurity, while normally an issue in rural areas, has become a serious threat in urban areas because of the lack of work or inability to move about, and because food prices have skyrocketed. Access to food, and sanitation supplies has become challenging for

thousands of Ugandans and the LCU has been organizing support across the entire country. Life For Uganda has sent a significant portion of the funds intended for our travel to the LCU to be used for Covid-19 relief. Please remember that it's because of the continued and faithful commitment of RLC that Life For Uganda is able to raise funds for our travel and work. We thank you for this unwavering support and we're blessed to provide some assistance to the LCU, even if it's from this great distance.

Dear RLS Families,

As Governor Cooper cautiously moves NC into "Phase 2" of the easing of restrictions in the state, I wanted to give you all an update on where RLS is in its planning for next school year, as well as finishing up its school year this year. Please remember this weekend is Memorial Day Weekend and **we will NOT operate Distance Learning on Monday, May 25**. Take time out to not only remember our service men and women who serve our country, but also those heroes who are combating this pandemic.

As our academic year winds down for the 2019-2020 year, we transition from our focus on Distance Learning (DL) academics to more of a celebration of the year. This has been quite a year, and it is important to celebrate the blessings God provided us even through the challenges. The last week of school traditionally has mainly been about finishing things off, collecting materials, cleaning out the students' materials, getting yearbooks, and having FUN! We think we still need to do all of those things this year.

Your student's teachers will not only be contacting you with a number of "housekeeping" items like which school materials need returning, but also some just for fun, wrap up the year, gatherings to bring closure to the school year for each class. **School wide we will have School Materials Return Days on June 2, 3, and 4.** This will be a time for school families to return textbooks, IT devices, etc. AND pick up **yearbooks** and any personal items that the students may still have left at school. We will order these days by family alphabetically with all materials picked up or dropped off from the gym. More details for this will come to you next week. Furthermore, an option for Standardized Testing/IOWA Testing will be forthcoming as well to you next week.

We WILL HAVE a year-end chapel on Friday, June 5th at 10:00 am as scheduled on our campus! Now, it will be a "parking lot/ in car" celebration, but we are working to make this as meaningful and as much fun as possible under our current circumstance. Furthermore, we are working on an "on campus" outside 8th Grade Graduation for later that night at 7:30 pm. Please stay tuned for much more details under a separate heading next week.

So many questions are still unanswerable about next school year, but we feel it is prudent for us to as soon as possible, put forth our 2020-2021 Academic Plan for Operation for all returning and new RLS student families. **Right now we plan on being PHYSICALLY OPEN for school on our scheduled start date (August 19)!** We have formed a Task Force to study all of the options for opening school safely. **This Task Force is made up of RLS Staff, Board members, parents, and community experts.** It is researching best practices for reopening schools from local, state, and national standards and norms striving to present the best options for all of our families and staff to be able to most fully participate in an RLS education safely. Calendar/scheduling options, spacing/distancing, enhanced cleaning/disinfection regimens, class size, and educational delivery options are just some of the items on this Task Force's agenda. Please look for reports from this Task Force soon. We thank you ahead of time for your patience as there are so many variables that this group is considering, but know that they are working hard to provide the best options available for your student and family.

Even if you may not be serving on the Task Force, we strongly desire to know your opinion. Traditionally our **Board of Directors puts forth an End-of-Year Survey.** This year is no exception. You will notice it has been tailored to our present situation. Once you receive the email notification, please take the time to give us the feedback that will help our Task Force and Board set the proper, God-blessed course for our safe return to school in 2020-2021.

Again, keep an eye out for much more from your child's teachers and me in the office for many more details about finishing this year strong and plans for next. I cannot thank you enough for your support of your teachers and us in the office during this unprecedented time. We miss seeing your children and you so much and know that tomorrow will be a brighter day with God's blessings.




