Dear family and friends,

It is Thursday evening and a letter from me must mean that we are once again sending out instructions about Sunday services. I pray that this finds you encouraged and strengthened in the grip of your loving God who continues to uphold and care for us all.

Live stream worship beginning at 9 AM continues this week for remote viewing only. In case you miss the service at 9, please check back or activate your YouTube app notifications to alert you to the video posting later in the day.

This Sunday our outdoor worship service, beginning at 10:30 AM, will also include the celebration of Holy Communion! Many of the guidelines for this service will continue for this week also:

- We ask that you arrive a little early; cars will be allowed into the parking lot as early as 10 AM.
- Please enter through the lower (Family Life Center side) parking entrance.
- Anyone giving an offering by envelope should prepare it ahead of time and submit it upon entering the parking lot.
- If you have the option of driving a smaller car, please do; trucks and vans must be parked in rows furthest from the front so as not to block the broadcast signal.
- If you have difficulty backing into a parking place, please arrive early and communicate that to the parking attendant upon entering the parking lot.
- Once parked on the church property, please do not move your car to a different parking place unless directed to do so by an attendant.
- Bathrooms will not be accessible as the church and school will be closed during the service; please remain inside your car at all times.
- Worship content will be broadcast to your car FM radio channel 87.9.
- If you unable to access the bulletin on your personal device during worship, please print it ahead of time and bring it with you; extra bulletins will also be made available.
- In the event of inclement weather, announcements about worship cancellation will be posted on our church web site by 8:30 AM Sunday morning.

Since we will also celebrate Holy Communion this Sunday, please also....

- Be prepared to tell the attendant at the parking lot entrance how many people in your car are communing and which of the four pre-packaged communion sets (wine + gluten host or "A," grape juice + gluten host or "B," wine + gluten-free host or "C," and grape juice + gluten-free host, or "D") are needed.
   Example: a car with three people communing and one person desiring grape juice instead of wine could ask for "2 'A's and 1 'B'."
- Each pre-packaged communion cup with host is hermetically sealed and sanitary. (You may observe them at this link: <a href="https://wccups.com">https://wccups.com</a>.) We ask that you keep the cup and cup base sealed and unopened until the beginning of Holy Communion.
- Return your empty individual communion cup at the end of the service to our volunteers in the parking lot as you leave to go home.

These are a lot of instructions to remember! No worries. We will have a pre-printed list of these instructions ready for you when you come...and guide you through the process.

If you signed up for small group in-person reception of Holy Communion on the afternoon of June 14, please remember...

- If you arrive early, remain in your car until 5 minutes prior to your scheduled worship time.
- Enter by the door nearest the church sanctuary, which will be open; the service will begin as promptly as possible. (There will be no need to handle either a hymnal or bulletin.)
- All worshipers, except for those under 2 years of age or otherwise unable to oversee their own personal use
  of a face mask, should enter the sanctuary wearing a face covering; face masks will of course be removed
  prior to reception of the Lord's Supper.
- If you need to use the rest room while in the building, please notify a staff member.
- Please exit and return to the parking lot by way of the office entrance.

Whether you worship with us at home or in your car this Sunday, let's all "make a joyful noise unto the Lord"!





### Council Corner -June 2020 Meeting

We opened our meeting with a reading from the Suffering Servant section of Isaiah and from the May 29<sup>th</sup> Portals of Prayer devotion. The emphasis was that God allowed the Romans to destroy the Jerusalem temple in 70 AD, as there was no more need for a sacrifice. Christ paid the whole price once, and for all. Our opening prayer was for Evangelism/Discipleship building at RLC.

- 1. May receipts were \$102,000, about the same as April. Expenses were also consistent with April at \$85,000. Net income was \$16,000, with a \$6,000 YTD position. Note the positive position is due to the use of Next 40 Debt reduction funds to pay our monthly mortgage payments for the last 2 months (\$25,000). Compared to our last budget period, giving is down \$36,000, with a corresponding offset in expenses. As part of the Constitutional requirement to maintain a balanced financial position, it is anticipated we will again pay the June mortgage payment from the Next 40 Debt Reduction account.
- 2. We are very thankful to our members that have increased their giving during this Covid-19 period. Any extra financial support in our final budget month (June) would be greatly appreciated as well, so that we can end our fiscal year in the best possible position.
- 3. As part of the year-end closing of the books, we have a Miscellaneous Fund of \$2,357 that needed to be designated. Council voted to use the funds to support our overall communications going forward (additional Zoom accounts for Bible and Group meetings, enhanced internet and wi-fi capabilities, and upgrading RCB) in order to expand our opportunities.
- 4. Council has begun working on the 2020-21 budget. Again, we are taking a "bottoms up" approach by asking Staff and groups to provide their next year's financial plans and expenses. The goal is to have a rough draft for the Council to review at its July meeting. We are looking to use the current April-June time frame to estimate new budget giving to enable us to present the formal budget for congregation approval at an August Voter's Meeting (assuming that we are in a Stage 3 Covid-19 state).
- 5. We reviewed the latest change to the Payroll Protection Plan loan forgiveness guidelines, which allow 24 weeks for the church to use the funds. Council will be developing an overarching policy on use of these funds, but final resolution will be something during the last half of 2020. As part of this policy, Council will begin looking at establishing some minimum congregational reserve limits.
- 6. Pastor Jonathan provided an update from the Service Time Change Taskforce. It is expected that they will be able to complete their work in early July and present their findings/recommendations to Council at its July meeting. Plans are to present a recommendation(s) at the pending August Voter's Meeting for member approval.
- 7. We currently have four RLC members who are, or will be, in ministerial training by September. Council approved the \$5,215 Endowment request to fund the non-S.E. District portion of Alan Shaw's SMP program. Council voted to include in its 2020-21 budget \$3,000 to support Micah Drengler during his final year of seminary. Payment will be made directly to the Seminary and we will publish the information if any members also want to contribute to his program. We have voted to allocate \$8,000 from the Next 40 Seminary fund to support Harrison Hulse and Ross Bowen as they start their ministerial training next year. We will also be setting up a dedicated account where members can additionally contribute.
- 8. The Council will be presenting a By-Law change proposal to revise Council terms to 3 years at the pending August Voter's Meeting. In anticipation of member questions, we have started a review of how this will impact individual Council member terms, if approved.
- 9. As part of the Congregational Goals/Action Plans, a timeline has been developed for the hiring of an Associate Pastor during our 2021-22 budget period. Included in this plan is a Fall 2020 "Intentional Giving'" emphasis that Pastor Jonathan will make during fall worship services and a larger Stewardship Campaign in early 2021 for late 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter start, that corresponds with the completion of the Next 40 giving campaign. Plan is to review overall program at the pending August Voter's Meeting.

10. Council began its initial discussion regarding establishing an enhanced Evangelism/Discipleship goal/action plan. We have defined Discipleship as "encouraging one another to grow in our faith" and Evangelism as "encouraging one another to share Christ with others." The correlation is that as we grow together as disciples, we become more confident in sharing our faith together, too. Pastor Jonathan presented a comprehensive location-based congregation map that will be a key component in getting us to share more with our nearby church neighbors and eventually to reach out more to non-RLC members in our neighborhood. He will be sharing more in future communications. A number of ideas were identified and will be assimilated into a master plan based on further discussion.


