Council Corner – July 2020 Meeting

We started our meeting by listening to a video that highlighted that despite all the negative things that are happening in our world, we will find Truth in God. He is the ultimate source of our strength.

The Council does not normally meet in July, but we chose to meet to focus on working on the new budget year (July 2020 to June 2021) for RLC, RLS, and RLP. This time budgeting is much more difficult given the impact Covid has had on so many aspects of each group.

- 1. June receipts of \$80,000 were lower than the past several months. Expenses of \$84,000 were also somewhat lower than prior months, resulting in a deficit of \$4,000. Included in this month's expenses were our final installment payment to PLM Families Together and funding for Safe Families and Build a Bunk. All Social Ministry projects outlined in the completed budget were funded, except for \$2,000 RLC Service Projects.
- 2. For the completed budget year, total income was approximately \$1.2M, about \$100,000 less than budgeted. Our total expenses were about \$1.2M, which did not include the \$37,000 Next 40 Debt Reduction funds and the \$9,000 Next 40 Ministry funds used for RLS Ethiopian Scholarship support. Excluding these 2 extraordinary funds usage, we finished the year with a \$1,500 surplus (or a negative \$46,000 if we count the extraordinary fund usage). The plan is to use the Church's PPP portion to reimburse these accounts once we have loan forgiveness.
- 3. Margaret Hyatt, our Operations Manager, reported that the 8 new Church security cameras are now installed, and signs indicated security camera usage have been posted on all entrances to the Church and both parking lot entrances.
- 4. Pastor Jonathan provided some initial insight on future in-church worship considerations, all of which are subject to our Governor Cooper's opening guidelines. More details to follow.
- 5. Council reviewed the planning for the upcoming August 16th Congregational Meeting. Meeting will be virtual, and details are being finalized. In addition to providing an update regarding our plans for hiring an Associate Pastor, the following items will be presented and voted on:
 - RLC, RLS, and RLP new budgets
 - Service Hours Change recommended by the Task Force and Council
 - Change the Church's By Laws for Council terms from 2 to 3 years
- 6. The initial budget drafts for RLC, RLS, and RLP were reviewed and discussed. Council will finalize its budget recommendations at its August 10th meeting. Both RLS and RLP showed in their budget proposals the impact of their PPP portion in their financials.
