



Council Corner – August 2020 Meeting

We started our meeting with a devotion highlighting that despite all the issues in our world, God has continually been and still is our source of strength.

The primary purposes of this meeting were to recommend the 20-21 RLP, RLS, and RLC budgets for congregational approval plus review/make an initial Service Change Next Step recommendation.

- 1. July receipts, the first month of our new budget year, were \$77,000. Expenses were \$89,000, resulting in a \$12,000 deficit. Included in this month's expenses were a \$9,000 payment for Missions Together, which is used to financially support our 3 Missionaries.
- 2. Teresa Gresham joined the meeting to provide an overview of the process the Service Change Taskforce completed. Details as to various options and survey results were shared. Council voted to approve the Taskforce Report with appreciation and the Council will send a thank you note to all participants. Council recommended that we implement changes beginning of next year or when we can return to normal schedule. In the meantime, we will continue on our Covid-19 schedule. We will survey the congregation to determine how Taskforce options will affect church attendance and Sunday School attendance prior to any implementation.
- 3. The first 20-21 budget to be finalized was the Preschool. For the 2019-20 budget year, RLP lost approximately \$5,000. The new budget, which includes lower compensation for the Director and Asst. Director has a -\$328 balance. This budget was approved by the Council for presentation to the congregation at the Voter's Meeting. In addition, the Council approved using approximately \$27,000 of PPP funding to pay for the benefits of both the Director and Asst. Director, as being Covid-19 related.
- 4. The second budget to be recommended for congregational approval was for RLS. In the last budget year, RLS had a deficit of \$32,000. In presenting the budget, in comparison to the initial draft presented in July, they have seen a significant increase in enrollment. Coupled with using their portion of the PPP funds, their budget proposal shows a \$34,000 surplus. They noted the considerable expenses associated with their new school model and Covid-19 management. Budget approved to be presented to the congregation.
- 5. For the completed RLC budget year, the church had a small surplus, noting that \$46,000 of mortgage and RLS Mekane Scholarship support was paid using Next 40 Debt Reduction and Ministry Funds, respectively. Without these funds, we would have had a \$46,000 deficit. For the 20-21 budget, the income forecast was the same as given in the prior budget actuals. All levels of expenses were examined to match expenses with income. In addition, the Council approved the Social Ministry portion of our budget. Major emphasis this year is assisting those who are been impacted by the Covid-19 virus.
- 6. Dave Geisler, Church Treasurer, informed the Council that \$40,000 from Next 40 Debt Reduction Fund was used to pay down our existing mortgage.
- 7. Council approved the Endowment Requests for Harrison Hulse and Ross Bowen. Funding from the Next 40 Ministry Fund was approved at an earlier Council meeting.
- 8. We received the initial 2021 Staff Benefits Plan, noting an approximate 9% annual increase. Our new budget reflects this change. Council decision to keep the same benefit plans as last year. More discussion will be held at the September Council meeting.

God Bless You Beyond A Sneeze

Potentially daily, you say the words "God Bless You". However, that typically takes place without much thought or intention. The words come more from habit than from the heart. Recently on Facebook, a mom suggested that with our new normal of having to take our children's temperature each day before heading off to school, that we use this opportunity to also bless our child(ren) at the same time. So what does it actually mean to bless your child? We have examples in the Bible of parents blessing their children. The account of Jacob and Esau portrays the importance of receiving a blessing from a parent. While the oldest child was to inherit the majority of the father's possessions and wealth, the blessing in and of itself also has much value. Think back to when you were a child. If you heard your parent tell your sibling that they loved them or how special they were, did you not get a little sad and want your parent to be saying those words to you? In a perfect world, parents would be blessing their child(ren) daily; not only when they die and their possessions are passed down to their children.

In such a time as we are now experiencing, our children are probably more frequently feeling fear, confusion, frustration, and uncertainty. Our children need to know daily that their parents love them unconditionally. More importantly, they need to know and be reminded that God is in control and loves them even more than their parents love them. God can love them perfectly and knows their needs completely. God will never let them down.

While it may be simple, I think it is a great opportunity to take a couple extra minutes each day to tell your child that you love them no matter what and to share God's love with them. If you want to do this by making the sign of the cross on their forehead or heart, or draw a heart or a cross on their hand, or whatever way you think of to help them start their day knowing they are not only your child, but God's child as well. As they go through their day they have this start to their day to fall back on as needed. As a mom of kids that are as old as some of you parents reading this, I know that children, no matter their age, never grow out of needing to know that their parents love them unconditionally and to be reminded of God's love for them. Don't stop blessing your children because you think they are too old. No one is ever too old to be blessed.

So, as we start a new school year, whether that be at home or in a school building, make it a habit to bless your children daily and see the difference it can make.


