Pastor's Corner, Week of November 1-7, 2020



Dear Resurrection saints,

Did you know that you are a saint? Saints aren't just the guys (and gals) in the pictures with the haloes. Saints are ordinary people that God uses for extraordinary ends. People like you and me.

I had a few saint sightings this past week. Maybe you did too. It started last weekend, with a group of folks who came together on a beautiful Saturday morning to work at making the surroundings of the church more beautiful... planting plants, trimming trees, putting in grass, and otherwise lifting the spirits of those who come and go from our church building! Then on Sunday I met a dozen or so RLC youth who came together to make a rainy afternoon a little brighter for kids taking part in our church's "Holy-ween Storytime." They dedicated several hours of their afternoon to make the event happen. There were volunteers coming and going and appearing all week long... folks that help with Confirmation homework, count and record offerings, appear on Zoom calls to share insights. I wish you could see all the saints that I see. Every week! And this weekend we are able to give thanks to God for the saints who touched our lives in especially important ways as we name aloud RLC members called home to heaven recently and share pictures of the saints we will always hold in our hearts. They are God's gift to us.

Once again, we welcome congregational singing this weekend in all services. Holy Communion will be celebrated Saturday evening (in-person only) and again on Sunday morning at 8 AM for our in-person live stream. This week the 10:45 praise and worship service will stay up on our YouTube channel. And please don't forget: we continue our "small group" Holy Communion gatherings after regular services in the main sanctuary at 1 PM (sign up here). As always, if you plan to attend in person, please use the appropriate sign up genius above or be prepared to sign in upon arriving at the sanctuary entrance. This allows us to prepare for those attending and do contact tracing, in the unlikely event that it should become necessary.

In place of our adult Sunday School class at 9:30 AM this Sunday we will be treated to an update about the important work going on in Uganda from the Uganda Mission team via Zoom. Topics will include: Covid-19 Impacts in Uganda, Remote Learning in the Villages, Seminary Education in Uganda, and other information. If you're already signed up for "Unshakable Hope" please tune in!

Finally, two weekends from now (November 7-8) will be Stewardship Weekend at RLC. Ours is a generous congregation. The saints of God here give cheerfully of their time and talent! We therefore hope that everyone attending worship either remotely or in person will take a little time to consider now what they have been gifted by God to dedicate to the service of others (RLC and other non-profits) in 2021. Hard copies of pledge cards will be made available for those who are with us in person this week, to be submitted the following week. Pledges may be directly submitted anonymously to us via our website. Our goal is not to leverage our system of giving to increase offering income. It is, rather, that each of us might give thanks to God for His faithfulness this year and consider what portion of the gifts we have received we choose to dedicate for others next year. That decision is between us and God.

Maybe like me you had a saint sighting this past week. Or maybe, like me, you're giving thanks to God this weekend for a saint already called home to heaven. There's still another way that All Saints Sunday hits home: you and I are saints too! From one forgiven sinner to another: let's live the life of the people God has declared us to be. Encouraged by the Spirit of the holy Son of God, our Savior Jesus Christ, we, together with all the saints, praise our God's holy Name.
