Pastor's Corner - Week of December 20-26



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The familiar lines of the Christmas pageant begin with words that youngsters stumble over: "In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria" (Luke 2:1-2). "Caesar Augustus" and "Quirinius" are not the easiest names to pronounce! Nevertheless, they both have important roles to play. They are the means for the story of Jesus' life to be grounded in history for those who knew only the earthly emperor and governor--not the heavenly King. Caesar, chief ruler of the Roman Empire, was called "Son of God" and "Savior" in his day. He is quickly overshadowed in the Christmas story by the King who would choose a cross as His throne and place of honor and glory. This King would be born in a town belonging to what was considered "the least" of the tribes of Israel...in a stable...as the child of a powerless, young, and (as yet) unmarried woman. But this child would accomplish the most noble and kingly act ever undertaken: the defeat of sin, death, and the Devil--the rescue of all who call on Him as Lord and Savior. As a result, the name "Jesus"--not "Caesar"--is more readily known by most schoolchildren today. It is the name we are privileged to call upon in our own times of need: the God of the universe, born--as one of us!

Here are a few of the usual updates related to our shared life:

- This weekend, Holy Communion will be available Saturday evening at 6 PM (12/19) and Sunday morning (12/20) at 8 AM. Holy Communion for 10 or fewer people is scheduled for 1:00 PM in the main sanctuary. Regular in-person services are limited to 50 or fewer worshippers, or roughly 20% of our seating capacity. As always, please sign up here if you plan to attend any regular weekend service in person.
- On Sunday, December 20 at 9:30 AM all who were registered for the fall Adult Sunday School class are
 invited to attend an introduction to Lutheran Hour Ministries and a preview of our winter study, A Man
 Named Martin. The December 20 session will be the last adult Sunday School class gathering for 2020.
 Be on the look out for a Zoom invitation in your Inbox by 9:15 AM on Sunday.
- Please note that though the seating for services on the 23rd and 24th is filling up (the sign up for all inperson participation in Advent, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services <u>can be found by clicking here</u>), two live streams--one at 4:30 PM on the 23rd and one at 8 PM on the 24th--will be made available via our YouTube channel. Holy Communion will be provided only at the 10 AM Christmas Day service. Please come prepared to wear masks for all services (including those on the 23rd) and be advised that seating limits of 50 people per service will be maintained. If you are unable to attend because seating for a service is filled, we ask that you avail yourself of the live stream option.
- No Saturday evening service will meet Saturday, December 26. All Sunday School classes will be on vacation December 27 and January 3.
- Please note that starting Sunday, January 10 our 10:45 Praise and Worship service will begin at 11:00 AM. This will allow our Sunday School slot on Sunday morning to have one full hour of session time via Zoom. As always, we will open the Zoom session fifteen minutes early (9:15) and leave it open for 15 minutes at the end (from 10:30 to 10:45) so that participants can visit with one another.

- Register now for A Man Named Martin and reserve your place in the class which starts at 9:30 AM January 10. Contact the church office with an email request by clicking here. Session guides can be downloaded for free from the Lutheran Hour Ministries website or picked up in the church office. You can watch a preview of the class by clicking here. - Finally, 1st Communion classes at RLC will begin for all interested 5th Graders on January 24th. To find out more, please contact Pastor Jonathan by clicking here.







Dear RLS Families,

As we come up to our 2 week Christmas break, I want to thank all of you for remembering our teachers and staff. The gifts and wrapped presents always make us feel appreciated by you. I also want to thank you for your diligence in keeping with our Healthy Together Plan. As our country and state see a spike in Covid cases, I am happy to report that we at RLS have NOT seen such a spike. This is due to you and your diligent efforts as well as our faculty and staff's diligence in keeping to our plan.

With that being said we know that the CDC is still strongly recommending curtailing travel and social gatherings over the Christmas holidays. I know this is not an easy "ask", but we encourage you to follow the same precautions as we did back at the start of our Thanksgiving break. So, just as before the RLS Board, staff, and I strongly recommend not traveling or gathering with anyone outside of your immediate family this Christmas.

You may also be aware that Wake County Public Schools will move back to all virtual classes for a 2 week period following the Christmas break. This decision was mainly based on the fact that WCPSS is having extraordinary difficulty in keeping their schools fully staffed. This is not the case at RLS and the Board has decided at its latest meeting this week to "stay the course" for RLS after Christmas break.

You may also be aware that our next Distance Learning period is scheduled for January 4 through February 11. Some families have already chosen this as an alternative to in-person learning for that period of time, but the overwhelming majority of our families are choosing to stay in-person. Additionally, if you are concerned about your child returning to school in-person after the holidays, we are offering a two week "buffer" time of Distance Learning that will take place from January 4 through January 15 (until the end of second quarter). This will entail additional planning on our teacher's part should you opt for this or the full period through February 11, so if you are choosing a virtual Distance Learning option, we ask that you inform me in the office AND your child's teacher AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

If something were to happen over the break to cause you to change to the Distance Learning option, we ask that you again reach out to us as soon as possible. There may be a lag of a school day or two to get your child "plugged in" to this option, so please be patient with our staff as we work to accommodate you. You would need to fill out and return the Distance Learning Agreement.

Finally, the news of vaccines is good. We pray that this and our continued diligence will start to bring an end to this worldwide pandemic.
