Transfiguration Sunday marks the transition from the Christmas and **Epiphany Seasons to** the Lent and Easter Seasons. Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In all my years of living in Japan I never climbed Mt. Fuji...but I did manage to summit one of the higher mountains (Mt. Aka) in the Yatsugadake range just south of the famous Japan Alps. The way to the top was long and difficult. You had to take the high altitude into consideration and let your body adjust. As we got near the top, the ground underfoot was treacherous and rocky. But the climb was worth it! The air at the summit was clear. Above the haze and lower clouds it seemed like you could see forever! None in our party wanted to leave and descend to the ordinary, work-a-day world. It seems only fitting, then, that our God chooses at times to reveal Himself on mountains: to Moses and Elijah on Sinai/Horeb and to Peter, James, and John on the mountain of Transfiguration. The tops of mountains transport those who climb them to dizzying heights—they are the sorts of places we imagine God must sit and look down upon the world. The disciples, however, did not ascend the mountain with Jesus for the view. "This is my beloved Son; LISTEN to Him!" the voice from the cloud says at His Transfiguration. As they descended the mountain and followed Jesus all the way to His cross and tomb, it was Jesus' Word (and with it, the promise of His victory over death and the grave) that would preserve and encourage them. Such is the gift we receive today for life's deepest, darkest valleys. It's not always what we see with our eyes...but what we hear with our ears...that is life-giving and Life-preserving!

Here's a bit of news this week:

- In-person worship services are back on. This weekend we welcome groups of up to 25 to sign up for Holy Communion at 6 PM on Saturday (February 13), 8 AM on Sunday, and again for Holy Communion at 11.

 If you plan to attend, we ask that you sign up for the service of your choice here. We are also resuming office hours and in-person events indoors at church for groups of 10 or fewer (masked and socially distanced, of course!). Risks associated with the pandemic continue. But the better numbers this week in our county, state, and nation are reasons to be thankful. Please get the vaccine if it is available for your demographic group and lovingly encourage those you know to do the same. Let's remain vigilant and caring for one another so that conditions for our in-person worship and events may continue.
- The Call Committee and I will complete interviews for candidates for Associate Pastor at Concordia Seminary later this week. Please continue to keep the unfolding process in your prayers. Also, we ask you to reserve the afternoon of February 28 (starting at 1 PM) for a congregational meeting via Zoom about the call. Any candidate or potential candidates being recommended as new RLC staff will be presented to the church at that time for a vote of approval. While this does not ensure we will receive an Associate Pastor from among those graduating Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, we look forward to seeing where our Lord leads us in the process.
- Ashes for Ash Wednesday are available this year for anyone to pick up for remote worship viewing. Small,
 disposable containers (one per family unit) for you to receive from church and use at home during our Ash
 Wednesday live stream. If you are not worshipping with us in person, you may also want to pick up a copy
 of our Lenten devotional "The Road Back to God" when you stop by.
- Ash Wednesday services will be in person, at 9 AM and 7 PM on February 17. Both services will also be live streamed. (This year, Resurrection Lutheran School students will take part via the live stream, from their classrooms). To sign up, please click here.

 A Memorial Celebration of Life in Christ at Resurrection Lutheran Church for Pastor Jim Knuth will be broadcast via live stream on February 20 at 1 PM. (In-person attendance will be limited to immediate family members only.) I will have instructions for connecting to the broadcast in my weekly letter on February 18, so please stay tuned.

I know I speak for all of us when I say that I am grateful Jesus did not stay on the mountain...but descended down into the valleys of life with all of us. Wherever we find ourselves this week we open our ears (and our hearts) to Jesus. We celebrate this final "epiphany" of the Epiphany season by resolving to listen to Him.
