Pastor's Corner — Week of February 21-27, 2021

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

"God will provide." How often might that sentiment have been tossed out easily by people in a position of comfort and luxury to those who were struggling "in the wilderness"? This weekend, we hear those words spoken by one who is, himself, in the wilderness: Abraham. Abraham has just been instructed by the Lord to offer up his son, his only son whom he loved, as that son Isaac, with the wood of the bonfire strapped to his back, asked where the lamb for the worship sacrifice might be. "God will provide," Abraham replies. We can only imagine the pain and confusion in Abraham's heart. Why does God require of Abraham the very child Abraham and Sarah had waited so long to embrace...the very child through whom God would bring all nations into His blessing? Abraham must not, could not, have understood. Neither do we. Yet even in the wilderness, Abraham waits on God's provision. For him, "God will provide" is more than a pious sentiment. It's a conviction rooted in God's faithfulness. No matter what we might give up in this season of Lent, it will never match the perfect sacrifice God provided for you and me in God's own dear Son Jesus Christ. Jesus is the lamb God would provide for the rescue of the world. The Lamb of God makes life in any wilderness this world throws our way worth living!

Once again, some announcements pertaining to our life together this week:

- This weekend we welcome groups of up to 25 to sign up for Holy Communion at 6 PM on Saturday (Feb 20), 8 AM traditional service on Sunday morning (with Holy Communion), and 11 AM Praise and Worship. A gathering of 10 or fewer people will also convene at 1 PM in the main sanctuary for Holy Communion. <u>To attend any of these services, please sign up for the service of your choice here.</u> We have resumed office hours and in-person events indoors at church for groups of 10 or fewer (masked and socially distanced). Please get the vaccine if it is available for your demographic group and lovingly encourage those you know to do the same. Let's remain vigilant and caring for one another so that conditions for our in-person worship and events may continue.
- This year's midweek Lenten services will follow the theme "In the Footsteps of Jesus" and focus on the historic places associated with the ministry of Jesus in the days leading up to His sentencing and death on a cross--and what it means for us today. We will gather for brief, 45-minute meditative services following the Order of Evening Prayer. Feel free to join us in person or online. Lenten offerings will go to support Lutheran Hour Ministries, Hope International, and the Inter-Faith Food Shuttle.
- For those unable to attend the Saturday morning "Welcome to Resurrection" sessions via Zoom, a single in-person session will be offered this Sunday (Feb 21) at 1:30 PM. Please come (with a mask) to the Fellowship Hall via either the main sanctuary or office entrance.
- Interviews with call candidates for the Associate Pastor position are completed, and we expect to send
 around information about the potential candidates by Wednesday, February 24. RLC hopes to have two
 full time pastors (myself and our new Associate Pastor) serving with soon-to-be SMP ("Specific Ministry"
 and so "part-time" Pastor) Alan Shaw. Please reserve the afternoon of February 28, starting at 1 PM, for
 a congregational meeting via Zoom about the calls in process. While this does not ensure we will receive
 an Associate Pastor from among those graduating Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, we look forward to seeing
 where our Lord leads us in this process.

- Many of you reading this (especially our newer members) may be unaware of a special fund established in 2018 for debt reduction, education endowments to RLC schools, mission work worldwide and in our community, and facility upgrades at RLC. The name of the fund is The Next 40. (Please see the attachment from 2018 that explains the fund.) Its purpose was to begin putting in place what was needed to be able to continue the mission of God at Resurrection for the next generation. Thanks to the generosity of RLC members over the last three years, much of the projected funding for The Next 40 has been received! Thank you! However, the window for giving closes soon (end of May, 2021) and our goal remains unmet. If you have been meaning to give to The Next 40 fund and have been unable to do so in the past, now is the time. <u>I encourage you to prayerfully consider a financial gift to this worthy cause by clicking here and filling in the line item for "Special Campaign: The Next 40."</u>
- A Memorial Celebration of Life in Christ at Resurrection Lutheran Church for Pastor Jim Knuth will be broadcast via live stream on February 20 at 1 PM. (In-person attendance will be limited to immediate family members only.) <u>If you plan to view the livestream, click here a few minutes before the service starts</u> (<u>1 PM on February 20</u>). The service will remain viewable after 1 PM and throughout the rest of the day on Saturday.

God provided a ram for Abraham and God provided a lamb of sacrifice for us today...a Lamb that brings us Life! This season of Lent, I encourage you to approach each day as a journey...a journey that might feel at times like a walk in the wilderness, but one in which God continues to provide all that we need, for each and every day.


Hope International

Council Corner - February 2021 Meeting

Monthly Report to the RLC Congregation of Highlights From our February Meeting

- RLC FINANCIAL REPORT AND BUDGET
 - Note that the monthly financials are available in the "Entire Church" group of RCB under the Files tab and a summary is also included in the Weekly Announcements.
- Review of BARNA research on "The Future of the Hybrid Church", and what impact the pandemic is having on Church
 - The most obvious impact is the use of digital online communications when in-person worship and discipleship services are drastically limited.
 - Four insights on the Hybrid Church Experience (from the report).
 - 1. There seems to be warmth toward digital and hybrid ministry
 - 2. But a preference for physical worship gatherings remains
 - 3. Distractions are challenges to online church
 - 4. Pastors developing hybrid ministry approaches need to extend beyond streamed services
 - Resurrection Lutheran Church is responding well to the challenges posed by "the hybrid church". We are embracing the challenges as opportunities rather than hindrances.
- SENIOR PASTOR REPORT TO CHURCH COUNCIL FEBRUARY 9, 2021
- Alan Shaw Ordination, 2021
 - Alan will be a Specific Ministry Pastor working part-time "alongside RLC pastoral staff in Word and Sacrament ministry to the congregation and partner with other RLC staff and church volunteers with a specific ministry focus on coaching and discipling."
- Associate Pastor Call Status
 - Dan Shaltanis, Chairman of the Call Committee, presented an update of the Associate Pastor Call process. Five seminarians have been interviewed. A recommendation for calling a candidate will be made by the Call Committee in concert with Pastor Jonathan. The congregation will be presented, discuss, and vote on the recommendation to Call at the Voter's Meeting scheduled for February 28, 2021.
- THE NEXT 40 CAMPAIGN UPDATE
 - The campaign concludes May 2021. It will have run for the three years per the brochure.
 - The projected total for the campaign is about \$250,000 less than planned. And, certainly, we are developing a plan of action to deal with the impact of a funding shortfall. However, we encourage the entire congregation, including those members who chose not to contribute at the beginning of the Campaign, to help RLC reach the original The NEXT 40 goal by considering a special stewardship gift between now and the end of May.
 - The funding emphases have not changed. The realities ... challenges facing the ministry of RLC have changed. From The NEXT 40 brochure from three years ago,

"The 40th Anniversary of Resurrection is a wonderful God-moment to celebrate what He has done, while strengthening and positioning our church for reaching out and building each other up in The NEXT 40."

"This funding emphasis is about the NEXT generation ... We want to be prepared to engage in and sustain emerging ministries and creative new ways to present the saving work of Jesus within our community and to the ends of the earth"

- The original funding emphases of the Campaign was, 10% to Missions, 37% to Paul Kibler Education Endowment Fund, 43% to Debt Reduction for Future Ministry, and 10% to Ministry Reserves (Planning for Future Facility Improvements). These funding goals were based on then current status, and a status quo future vision for RLC. No one did or could forecast the impact of a world-wide pandemic on RLC's ministries.
- Facility Maintenance and Improvement, and upgrades to RLC's Digital Communications Systems capabilities to meet the current and future vision of RLC (the Hybrid Church data) are the most pressing needs.
- The Church Council will analyze the situation (considering any funding shortfall), come to conclusions / actions that appear to be in the best interests of RLC, and draft a plan of action for the congregation's review and vote.


