Pastor's Corner — Week of February 28-March 6, 2021

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In social media sites, to follow a person or organization is to subscribe to their posts in order to gain instant access to their thoughts or ideas. Sometimes on-line information appears authoritative and worth following when it really isn't. And a pervasive trend is the phenomenon of "following the crowd" in reading customer feedback on Amazon or restaurant reviews on Yelp. In a massive controlled experiment of Internet users published recently in the journal Science, product ratings were found to be highly susceptible to irrational herd behavior. Comments that received fake positive reviews from researchers were much more likely to receive positive votes than those from the control group. At least when it comes to on-line shopping, it seems, people really do follow the crowd. Jesus' question to the disciples in our Gospel reading this week prompts the question to each and every one of us, "Who are you following?" In the realm of faith, this of course encompasses so much more than the daily news or what others might think about the best new brand of dog food. It has to do with matters as profound as the meaning and purpose of life itself... the source of true peace...the origin of love and the empowering of our own expression of love and service. Who are you following? As we begin to answer that question the subversive God...the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit...turns our attention away from the hype and the hoopla, away from the crowds and our own short attention span, away from our all-consuming need to profit and improve, to what truly endures: the love of God for the world revealed for each and every one of us, in the cross of Christ. We are followers of the cross-bearer! We are disciples of the crucified and risen Son of God! As we find meaning and peace in the cross of our Lord and Savior this week, let's look for ways to share that with others along the way.

Here again are my weekly updates:

- This weekend we welcome groups of up to 25 to sign up for Holy Communion at 6 PM on Saturday (Feb 27), 8 AM traditional service on Sunday morning, and 11 AM Praise and Worship (with Holy Communion). Small group Holy Communion at 1 PM will not meet due to the congregational meeting this Sunday afternoon. To attend any of these services, please sign up for the service of your choice here. Please get the vaccine if it is available for your demographic group and lovingly encourage those you know to do the same.
- This year's midweek Lenten services follow the theme "In the Footsteps of Jesus" and focus on the historic places associated with the ministry of Jesus in the days leading up to His sentencing and death on a cross--and what it means for us today. This week we go to the "Southern" or "Teaching" Steps of the Jerusalem temple...stone slabs upon which Jesus and his listeners would have likely stood, and experience Jesus' teaching about "the stone the builder rejected." Photos from our trip will be added to the live stream message. Feel free to join us in person or online--the in-person sign up is the same as the link above. Lenten offerings will go to support Lutheran Hour Ministries, Hope International, and the Inter-Faith Food Shuttle.
- This Sunday at 1:00 PM we will gather via Zoom to discuss our recommendation regarding future pastoral staff at Resurrection Lutheran Church. Assuming all continues to go well with his seminary classes, Vicar Alan Shaw will become "Pastor Alan Shaw" in June of this year and serve in a part-time capacity as a coach, counselor, and Christian conciliator as he completes his two years of SMP instruction. He will be on hand to speak about what a "Specific Ministry Pastor" is and how we can keep his continued work and service among us in our prayers. The Associate Pastor Call Committee will also present their recommendation for a general

call to (and ranked preference regarding) three candidates who will graduate from Concordia Seminary St. Louis this year: Seminarians Zachery Sarrault, Brenden Harrell, and Bradley Singer. Calling a seminary graduate differs from a traditional call in many ways, two of which I'd like to specify here: (1) We do not work with the individual seminary candidates themselves, so much as the Call Placement Supervisor, Dr. Glenn Nielsen, who must work to ensure that all graduating seminarians are sent to congregations where the seminarian AND the church he serves will be blessed. (2) We recognize that not only does God work though the interviews our Call Committee has with each candidate...He also is at work in those who have overseen these men and know their character: vicarage and field work supervisors, seminary faculty, and so on. For that reason, we are encouraged to consider more than one "choice" and invite others who know these men well to enter into the decision process, too. The Call Committee would like you to know their order of preference for these three men, but it is important for folks to understand that not one but three candidates are on our list. Much more could be said here! To hear more, I encourage you to join us this Sunday. Please reserve the afternoon of February 28, starting at 1 PM, for a congregational meeting via Zoom about the calls in process. An invitation was sent around by Church Council President Barry Needle yesterday...and we will send it around again on Sunday. You can sign up to attend in person by clicking here.

• Many of you reading this letter (especially our newer members) may be unaware of a special fund established in 2018 for debt reduction, education endowments to RLC schools, mission work worldwide and in our community, and facility upgrades at RLC. The name of the fund is The Next 40. (I've included an attachment at the bottom of this email from 2018 that explains the fund.) Its purpose was to begin putting in place what was needed to be able to continue the mission of God at Resurrection for the next generation. Thanks to the generosity of RLC members over the last three years, much of the projected funding for The Next 40 has been received! Thank you! However, the window for giving closes soon (end of May, 2021) and our goal remains unmet. If you have been meaning to give to The Next 40 fund and have been unable to do so in the past, now is the time. I encourage you to prayerfully consider a financial gift to this worthy cause by clicking here and filling in the line item for "Special Campaign: The Next 40." "Who do YOU say that I am?" Jesus asks. Together with Peter, we too say "You are the Christ!" Knowing our own need, we also say, "You are my Savior." Though our faithfulness in following Jesus is not always what it should be, the One we follow still uses us to point others to His cross and empty tomb. We share that message again this year with those around us.


Hope International




