Pastor's Corner — Week of March 14-20, 2021



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It's not unusual in some places to find crosses in higher elevations. (See the photo, above, courtesy of Bart MS from Pixabay). Did you ever stop and consider that Jesus' elevation over all creation as the glorified Son of God began with His cross? An object as ordinary and even as contemptable as a cross was the means for God to accomplish God's miracles...even the salvation of the world. Similarly, mere words and ordinary bread and wine might appear to be inadequate to the task of accomplishing great things. But in God's hands, they (like all of us), are used for extraordinary results in the worship life of God's church. Worship, in the end, isn't about what WE do at all. It is, according to the German expression Gottesdienst... literally, God's serving all of us, His people. And so the lodestar of our faith journey is the undeserved love of God for all the world. You will hear it again this weekend in our Gospel reading, "For God so loved the world that He gave his one-and-only Son..." You can also hear that same priority in Resurrection's mission statement, that "by grace through faith in Christ we reach out to all with His love and build each other up for service." What joy to know that, though we have a one-of-a-kind God who services us with a one-of-a-kind love through one-of-a-kind means of grace, we have the freedom to gather together to receive those gifts as people who are diverse as the world God loves! In this season of Lent, may that gathering focus on the Lord of the cross...Jesus Christ...who lifted up from the earth, "will draw all people to [himself]" (John 12:32)!

Here's some other matters to ponder during this week of your Lenten journey:

- Don't forget that Daylight Savings Time begins this Sunday, March 14, at 2 AM. If you plan to be with us
 that morning, don't forget to get to bed a little early on Saturday and set your clocks ahead one hour
 Saturday night.
- With all that this year holds in store, I'd like to invite ALL Resurrection members to stand up and be counted. Last year our Stewardship Pledge Drive resulted in 75 of the roughly 400 households of our congregation pledging to support the mission and ministry at RLC with a portion of their income. (In other words, 75 of our member households determined ahead of time how much of their income they could reasonably expect to contribute to RLC, rather than giving a regular offering based on what was "on hand" at the time). If you or the members of your family were one of those 75 households, I thank you from the bottom of my heart. You are all set! But there are at least 300 households who were not able to join us in this challenge last year. I would like to see us add 50 NEW pledges--people who have never made a pledge to RLC--to the 75 or so gathered last November. The pledge will be for monies spent in the period beginning July 2021 (fiscal 2022). Asking 50 out of 300 family units to stand up and be counted is a modest goal. We can do it. If you did not take part in the November 2020 pledge event, please consider giving in the new fiscal year. Especially if you or someone you love stands to benefit from the service of our new under-shepherd and his ministry to young families and single adults, I invite you to <u>submit the pledge form online by clicking here</u>.

- Beginning Thursday, April 15, RLC member Bob Williams will be facilitating a 9-week class on money management that also sheds light on God's work of leading us to manage ourselves. It is called "Financial Peace University" and it is life-changing! The class will gather via Zoom each week on Thursday evening. More to come later...but clear your calendar for Thursday in mid-April to early June if you are interested in taking part.
- This weekend we welcome groups of up to 50 to sign up for Holy Communion at 6 PM on Saturday (March 13), the 8 AM Traditional Service Sunday morning, and 11 AM Praise and Worship (with Holy Communion). Small group Holy Communion at 12:30 PM will also meet. Midweek Lenten services following the theme "In the Footsteps of Jesus" this week to the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus would be arrested prior to His trial and crucifixion. The Order of Worship is "Holden's Evening Prayer." Lenten offerings will support Lutheran Hour Ministries, Hope International, and the Inter-Faith Food Shuttle. 

We ask that you consider the needs of your congregation when you make decisions about the legacy you would like to leave behind this year. If there is something you believe we could be doing better in our use of what is entrusted to us at RLC, please do not hesitate to reach out to me.

We are still collecting Mites for Missions, but changed the procedure in 2021.



Chainsaw Safety and Fundamentals Class

Interested in serving in disaster response, specifically chainsaw work and debris clearing? Would you like to learn how to operate a chainsaw safely and effectively? Even if you've never operated a chainsaw before, that's OK!

On **Saturday, March 20**, Hope Lutheran Church in Wake Forest will host an all day (8:30 am-4:00 pm) Chainsaw Safety and Fundamentals class, which includes classroom instruction in the morning and hands-on training in the afternoon. Current pandemic health/safety protocols (face coverings, social distancing) will be employed throughout the day. Participants will learn the ins and outs of safety in the chainsaw environment, both from an operator and bystander perspective, proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), basic chainsaw maintenance, and cutting techniques.

Even if you've taken a similar course before, this class offers various new material and will be a great 'refresher' for anyone who's looking to hone their experience.
