Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On this weekend that we count down the days of the last week of Lent, you have to use your head a bit. Sunday, March 28 will be a day of paradoxes. On the one hand it is Palm Sunday...a celebratory day. Together with those who welcome Jesus to Jerusalem, we are invited to wave our palm branches or tie our palm fronds into a cross and shout "Hosanna!" (Help!), knowing that Jesus our King is coming to the rescue! On the other hand, it is a somber day of reflection called "Sunday of the Passion." It is a day we witness the uncomfortable image of Jesus, the crucified King, crying out in the words of the despairing Psalmist (see Ps 22): "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" At times Jesus appears to be a person in NEED of saving, rather than the Savior He truly is.

What gives? (Or in the immortal words of our beloved catechism, "What does this mean?") Jesus is a king...but no ordinary king. Therein lies the significance not only of the week ahead but the entire Christian faith journey. The Sunday before Easter is a day that makes you think. Faith in Jesus doesn't mean we get the goodies we ask or work for. The Christian faith doesn't entail the straightforward religious arithmetic of "God's attention to my circumstances = my sacrifice + my sincerity." It is founded instead on a King...a King who gave up everything. It is made possible by One identified as "Son of God"...but who came to be obedient unto death so that sinners might be reconciled to their Creator. Jesus is a King who suffers death and hell on a cross so that we do not get what we think we want--but what we truly need--forgiveness and abundant Life. Thank God that the simple solution to our complicated circumstances is the Son of God, Jesus Christ crucified. As we shout or pray "Help!" again this year, may the Spirit of God enlighten us to seek the help of the Savior of paradoxes: the Lord who brings glory to a cross and Life to a stone cold tomb. Hosanna in the highest!

Here's some other stuff to consider at the start of your Holy Week, 2021:

- In light of the most recent executive order from Governor Roy Cooper, we will be opening worship services beginning Maundy Thursday (April 1) to 75 or fewer worshippers. If you have already encountered a full service for Holy Week, please check back this coming Saturday (or later) and try signing up again. The inperson sign up for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter weekend services can be accessed here. If you prefer worshipping outdoors to indoors, please note that Saturday, April 3 we will host an outdoor Easter service in the Prayer Garden at 6 PM. Masks will be worn by worshippers in all services.
- This Sunday (March 28) marks the final session of our 11-week Bible Study "A Man Named 'Martin'". I would like to thank facilitators Mindy Stephani, Bob Unger, Dan Mitchell, Jacin Suskin, and Bob Shimmel for their guiding us through these sessions. Many thanks are due also to Todd Trautman, for working behind the scenes in the area of tech assistance. We will take a brief vacation from Adult Sunday School on Easter Sunday and resume sessions April 11. Bob Williams will lead our gathering on the 11th with a presentation on estate planning and building a legacy that lives on at RLC. Then our spring Bible class will begin April 18, facilitated by yours truly. It is entitled "Race and the Gospel." You can view the preview for the class by clicking here. Study guides in digital format are available at no cost through your RightNow Media account (search inside the platform for "Race and the Gospel") and are also printed out for you to pick up any time at church. To register for the class, send an email with your name to office@rlcary.org.

- With all that this year holds in store, I'd like to invite ALL Resurrection members to stand up and be counted. Last year our Stewardship Pledge Drive resulted in 75 of the roughly 400 households of our congregation pledging to support the mission and ministry at RLC with a portion of their income. (In other words, 75 of our member households determined ahead of time how much of their income they could reasonably expect to contribute to RLC, rather than giving a regular offering based on what was "on hand" at the time). If you or the members of your family were one of those 75 households, I thank you from the bottom of my heart. You are all set! But there are at least 300 households who were not able to join us in this challenge last year. I would like to see us add 50 NEW pledges--people who have never made a pledge to RLC--to the 75 or so gathered last November. The pledge will be for monies spent in the period beginning July 2021 (fiscal 2022). If you did not take part in the November 2020 pledge event, please consider giving in the new fiscal year. I invite you to submit the pledge form online by clicking here.
- Beginning Thursday, April 15, RLC member and financial planner Bob Williams will be facilitating a 9-week class on money management that also sheds light on God's work of leading us to manage ourselves. It is called "Financial Peace University" and it is life-changing! The class will gather via Zoom each week on Thursday evening. You can view a preview of the class here. Jesus once wore a crown of thorns. Jesus took our sins upon Himself. He gave up everything so that you and I might be numbered among those who are no longer just sinners but "forgiven sinners." Hosanna to the King of Kings!




