Pastor's Corner for Week of April 25-May 1



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It's all about love. Can things really be that easy? Well...yes and no. It IS really all about love, love that doesn't originate with you and me at all, as our text for this weekend (1 John 3:16-24) makes clear: "We know love by this, that [Christ] laid down His life for us." But Christ Jesus' love can't help but have its way with you and me...so much so that "We ought to lay down our lives for one another" (3:16). That is where love (humanly speaking) gets hard! It is all so easy to write about in a letter like this or say in a sermon...yet so difficult to put into practice! This past week, the trial of Derek Chauvin focused our attention on the death of George Floyd. Joshua Salzberg, co-founder of LCMS organization called "Lutherans for Racial Justice," reminds us: Derek Chauvin is not our only focus as we gather to seek the mercy of the One who dyecast what real love looks like. THAT story concerns each of us: You and me: "I was not willing to lay down my life for George Floyd or Breonna Taylor," Salzberg writes. "Most days, I'm not willing to lay down my coffee for a friend, let alone lay down my iPhone or my job or my life ambitions. No, most days when faced with the needs of my neighbor, I'm less likely to respond with Godly compassion and more likely to respond with the words of Cain: 'Am I my brother's keeper?'" The original love that is defining for all of us today is not your love or mine--and thank God for that! It is the love of our Good Shepherd Jesus, who laid down His life for His sheep (John 10:11). Now, that Good Shepherd who carries us through life--with its green pastures, still waters, and valley of death--also "leads us into paths of righteousness, for His name's sake" (Psalm 23:3). Wherever and however our life vocations invite us to follow in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd this week, we pray with Luther, that "the Old Adam in us might, by daily contrition and repentance, be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever." God's love for sinners like you and me (and through us, for the world!) is what it's really all about.

Here is the news I have to pass on this week:

- Plans are underway for transitioning some worship elements (e.g., distribution of the Lord's Supper) to practices that more closely resemble what was going on at RLC before the pandemic started. A little over one year ago, we halted in-person worship services all together. One year ago, we offered in-person Holy Communion to groups of 10 or fewer and started meeting in-person in the church parking lot. Then, 8 months ago, we resumed in-person services in the main sanctuary and Family Life Center with a prescribed practice of Holy Communion that minimized interactions between us and contact with surfaces. CDC guidance has been relaxed somewhat in the last few weeks, and though we still strive to maintain a wholesome environment in our worship spaces, I believe it is time to revisit and restore some of the traditions and practices surrounding the celebration of the Lord's Supper that we know and love. Please be on the look out for information in this space that will detail our plans for the celebration of the Sacrament in the weeks to come!
- Sign up here for worship services this Saturday and Sunday, April 24 and 25. Holy Communion will be offered at 6 PM Saturday evening. Then, we will host two services on Sunday morning at 8 and 11 AM, with Holy Communion offered in the 11 AM service. In-person worshippers are limited to 75 persons per service. Smaller services of Holy Communion for groups of 10 or fewer will continue to be offered throughout most Sundays in May at 12:30 PM. (Please note that, due to a private baptism at 12:30 small-group Holy Communion on May 2 will not be available.)

- There is just one week left in our "Count Me In" pledge drive. We still have space for roughly 10 first-time pledges. If you didn't submit a pledge last fall and have not yet done so this year, this is the week. This week my stewardship focus is on the sacrificial aspect of giving. Whether it is our time, our talent/interests, or our treasure, we are called to respond to God's gift of life in a concrete way. Is such a sacrifice "necessary" for our salvation? No! Is it an appropriate response to what God has done for us through Christ Jesus? You bet! (See what St. Paul has to say on the topic: Romans 12:1). What a blessing it is to be not only church "consumers" but active participants in the family of God. To make a first-time pledge, submit your pledge form online by clicking here. Thank you, thank you, thank you for all who have given so generously on behalf of our congregation's kingdom work. We can't do what we do without you!
- Save the date: April 28. This is the day for Assignments of Calls to candidates for the pastoral office at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. Make plans now to watch the live stream of the Call Service that day to see the outcome of our call extended to three potential candidates in the seminary's class of 2021. To find out more, access the website for Call Day by clicking here. Church members are invited to meet and greet the new Associate Pastor -Elect in a Zoom call beginning at 9 PM that evening. - A Celebration of Life in Christ for Barbara Schaeffer and rite of committal in the RLC columbarium will be held at Resurrection on May 8 at 3 PM for immediate family only. 2021 is shaping up to be a busy year at Resurrection. We foresee opening our church campus to a new worship and small group schedule this fall. We look forward to engaging more intentionally with our local neighborhoods in person. And, following our most recent church meeting, we have submitted call documents for one of three candidates soon-to-graduate Concordia Seminary, St. Louis as our new Associate Pastor! All of it, of course, is not possible without the prayer, love, and support of all of you.



This week, we talk about how God Gives the Ten Commandments, Exodus 20:1-17.




