The day of Pentecost is the birthday of the Christian Church. This celebration takes place 50 days after Easter (the word Pentecost means 50<sup>th</sup> day). On this day, the Holy Spirit breathed upon men and women from

around the world and sent them

to share the wonderful news of God's love for the world.

The "tongues of fire" that were seen above the heads of the disciples were a sign of God's presence, just as God used fire as a sign of His presence in the Old Testament. He spoke to Moses from a burning bush, then He lighted the way for the Israelites as a pillar of fire at night as they fled Egypt for the Promised Land. This is why we celebrate Pentecost with the color red.

Other customs have been used by the Christian Church to help focus on Pentecost. During the Middle Ages, roses were dropped from the rafters to simulate the tongues of fire. Trumpets were used to simulate the sound of the rushing wind. A live dove was set free inside the church, or a carved one was lowered down from the roof to remind us of the gift of the Holy Spirit.

During the season of Pentecost, we place a special focus on applying Christ's life and teachings to our lives. Today, as we celebrate Pentecost, we recall the gifts God has given each us, through the Holy Spirit, so that we can respond to His love for us in Christ by reaching and teaching and caring for others.

## Pastor's Corner for Week of May 23-29



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our Old Testament text for this weekend is all about the life-restoring work of the Holy Spirit. In it, God appears in a vision to the prophet Ezekiel. Ezekiel had an unenviable task. He was to be prophet to the people of Israel while they faced the most overwhelming endings you can imagine. Israel had turned its back on God and lost the symbols of God's power and strength: they were defeated by the Babylonians...their king was taken prisoner...their temple destroyed. Change and defeat had knocked the air out of their lungs, you might say. The people, as they lived in captivity, felt dazed, dried up, and dead--like discarded bones on a valley floor. Still, God had a plan. "Can these bones live?" God asked the prophet. "I'll leave that to You, Lord," Ezekiel seems to say with a sigh. There appeared to be no hope for Israel. But God wasn't done with these dead, dry bones. Ezkiel was to preach to them...then to the breath/wind/Spirit that would enter them. And once these bones were enfleshed and enlivened, Ezekiel was to tell them that their hope was not lost..that the endings they've experienced are not the End...that with God's Spirit on them, they would live. They might have given up on God, but God had not given up on them, for God wasn't done with them yet! On this Pentecost weekend, the same holds true for you and me. We have received the gift of God's Holy Spirit. Though the world will prove skeptical and will even ridicule the Church of Christ (not unlike the way it first did some 2000 years ago), you and I, "dead bones" enlived by the Spirit of the living God, are empowered to live with courage, hope, and joy. Our power is fleeting. God's promises last forever!

Here's some information concerning our shared life that you'll want to know about:

Based on CDC guidance, Governor Cooper issued an executive order May 14<sup>th</sup> that allows for even large groups of people in the state of North Carolina who have been fully vaccinated for COVID-19 to gather indoors without masks or need for social distancing. Since then, new daily cases of COVID in Wake County over the last couple of days has, for the very first time since October 2020, moved from "high" to "medium" risk (down to 8.8 new cases for every 100,000 residents). In consultation with RLC staff and servant leaders, *the following guidelines for worship will be put in place, beginning Memorial Day weekend (May 29-30):* 

- First, please note there will be three worship services on May 30 at 8, 9:30, and 11 AM (Holy Communion at 11 AM only), followed by the opportunity for Small Group (10 or fewer) Holy Communion at 12:30 PM.
   To attend in person for any service that day, please sign up here via the link for the service you choose.
   (Note that Small Group Holy Communion will not be available June 6, due to the Voters' Meeting that day.)
- Social distancing for all aspects of worship beginning May 29 (except for the reception of Communion elements at the communion rail) will not be required. Limited reserved seating in both the sanctuary and Family Life Center will be available for those who wish to maintain social distancing.
- Also starting May 29, masks during worship will no longer be required for all who are fully vaccinated. Some
  who are fully vaccinated may continue to wear a mask on a voluntary basis. We do ask that you continue to
  wear a mask if you are not yet fully vaccinated or in the process of becoming fully vaccinated. Activities
  specifically involving children such as Vacation Bible School will, at this time, require the use of a mask for
  ages 5 and up so as to protect our unvaccinated population.
- Worship services in May will continue to be livestreamed at 8 and 11 AM. Weekly livestreams will continue, but we are discussing possible changes to the weekly livestream schedule starting in June.
- Those who are preparing and serving Communion will continue to wear masks and gloves for the time being.
- Use of the nursery continues to remain on hold, for now.

While we encourage all who are able to do so to get the vaccine, we rejoice that the benefits of the Covid vaccine enable us to take these important steps! The ten days between now and then allow us to prepare for these changes with our staff and worship volunteers so that we are able to welcome all who gather in person with us in as caring and worshipful a manner as possible. I appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we move forward together with these changes over Memorial Day weekend.

With that note, allow me to underline that *current mask and social distancing rules still apply for worship services this Pentecost weekend, May 22 and 23*. Sign up here for in-person worship services. Holy Communion will be offered at 6 PM Saturday evening. Then, we will host two services on Sunday morning at 8 and 11 AM, with Holy Communion in the 11 AM service. Small Group Holy Communion (10 or fewer) will still be available at 12:30 PM.

In addition to the new mask and social-distancing policy initiated over the weekend of May 29 and 30, please note the following dates:

- June 6: Youth-led worship service at 11 AM; Voters' Meeting (hybrid format) starting at 1 PM.
- June 27: Ordination and Installation of Pastor Alan Shaw.
- July 18: Ordination and Installation of Pastor Zachery Sarrault.

We've been seeing more and more of you over the last few weeks! And I look forward to begin gathering with RLC members mid-morning for a traditional worship service at 9:30, starting May 30. But all of that activity also brings about a challenge: we are in need of worship volunteers. Even if you have never ushered, greeted folks at the door, read a Bible verse, or assisted with the communion distribution, I invite you to be in touch with us so that we can train you for any one of these roles and add you to our regular rotation. Interested parties should reach out to our Lay Ministry Standing Committee Chair, Mike Hahne, here.

Finally, as Sunday School for RLC children, youth, and adults winds down this weekend, I'd like to turn your attention to Sunday School opportunities in the 2021-2022 year. If you are interested in either leading or facilitating a Sunday-morning Bible study at RLC for adults, either individually or as a part of a team, please let me know by sending me an email at this address. I'm compiling a list of interested individuals. If you'd like to assist with Sunday School for children, I invite you to reach out to our Children's Ministry Director, Lea Webb, here. Even if you do not choose to lead/facilitate a study for adults, but would like to offer input into the types of studies offered, I invite your feedback. Stay tuned for information about a class I plan to offer starting late June for all who are interested in learning more about how to read the Bible with understanding.

Hey Resurrection Family!






