#### Pastor's Corner for Week of June 6-12



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This is the time of year that many of you are attending the college and high school commencement exercises of your children and grandchildren. How important it is to give thanks to God for the accomplishments made (especially in a pandemic year) while looking forward to future challenges, too! Several years ago I attended my daughter's college graduation and noted that the school mascot had changed from an "Indian" (the mascot in my day) to a "Griffin." Yet it was clear in the speeches we heard over the weekend...delivered by everyone from the school president to the students themselves...that folks viewed their school as "one tribe" or as a place where each person was a member of "one family." Whether the bonding experience of surviving late night cram sessions, the sense of community forged through several years of dormitory living, or the shared dreams of future worlds conquered, it was clear that this "tribe" thing stuck. That made me think: the need for community, so important for young people who have left home and were starting to make it on their own is at the heart of what it means to be human. Whether "Cheers" ("I wanna go where everybody knows your name") or "Friends" {"I'll be there for you"), Hollywood has taken notice! But it is nothing new. The Bible begins with the recognition "It is not good for man to be alone" (Gen 2:18). It ends with the vision of the new Jerusalem, the "home of God among mortals" (Rev 21:3). Everyone, you might say, wants—and needs—to belong to a tribe. The Word of God itself professes it to be so.

In our Gospel reading for this weekend, we see Jesus creating a new community. Blood relations will always be important, but a new community—brothers and sisters in Christ—are the people among whom we are given to live and thrive. We all gather together around Jesus. We all share in one another's joy and grief. We all know our need for forgiveness--and receive it, together. And though we will always be an imperfect bunch on this side of eternity, what joy, not only to look forward together to the coming kingdom, but to go to work together as God grows His eternal family here below! I pray that no matter where life might take our most recent graduates, they might always cherish the embrace of God through their brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus. Join us this Sunday at 11 AM, as we celebrate the achievement of RLC high school graduates and as they chart new paths for the future, pray God's blessing on each and every one of them.

Here also is some information worth keeping in mind....

#### The following guidelines for worship are now in place:

- In addition to Saturday evening worship services at 6 PM, there are now three worship services every Sunday: at 8, 9:30, and 11 AM. Small group Holy Communion on Sundays at 12:30 PM will be limited to two times a month throughout the summer (this month: 6/13 and 6/27). We will be doing away with the SignUp Genius for ordinary services, but ask that you continue to use the sign up for small group communion.
- Social distancing for all aspects of worship (except for the reception of Communion elements at the communion rail) will not be required. Limited reserved seating in both the sanctuary and Family Life Center will be available for those who wish to maintain social distancing.
- Masks during worship will no longer be required for all who are fully vaccinated. Activities specifically involving children such as Vacation Bible School will, at this time, require the use of a mask for ages 5 and up so as to protect our unvaccinated population.
- Worship services will continue to be livestreamed at 8 and 11 AM.
- Those preparing and serving Communion will continue to wear masks and gloves, for now. Please know that those distributing wine and communion wafers to RLC worshippers are fully vaccinated.

- Activity bags will be available for our youngest worshippers. We ask that families desiring these materials pick them up and return them upon entering and leaving the sanctuary/Family Life Center.
- We ask that offerings continue to be submitted electronically or placed in offering plates on tables near exits by those who are worshipping with us in person.
- Use of the nursery will remain on hold for regular worship services, for now.

#### Beginning this weekend, the schedule for Holy Communion will change.

The change allows us to live stream worship content at 8 and 11 without two services of Holy Communion on the same morning. Starting this weekend, Holy Communion will be offered...

- Every Saturday at 6 PM
- Every first and third Sunday, at 8 AM
- Every second and fourth Sunday, at 9:30 AM
- Every second, fourth, and fifth Sunday, at 11 AM.

And whether or not you'd like to lead a small group or general Bible study this fall, I invite you to check out my summer class on Reading the Bible for Understanding. Let's try gathering in-person, but if you are interested in taking part and are unable to attend in-person, please let me know and I'll look into the possibility of making the class available virtually also. The class will meet Wednesday evenings at 6:15 PM, starting June 16 and ending August 4. <u>You can register for the class at office@rlcary.org.</u> The book (available through Concordia Publishing House) costs around \$15.00.

Wednesday evenings Bible at RLC will continue with my Christian doctrine class, "This Is the Church" (starting at 7:30 PM). Again, let's try to gather in person. The class will begin June 16 and go through July 21. Our textbook for "This Is the Church" is the Bible...with Luther's Small Catechism as a roadmap. This is a great class

#### Service and mission to our community and world:

I'd like to close with the following announcement: Gar and Ann Johnson, who have been faithfully serving for many years on behalf of Christian Library International and getting the word out about them to members of our church (CLI is an organization bringing hope to prisoners around the world through the Gospel of Christ) are looking for others who might be interested in joining them in this important ministry. I have toured the CLI facility in Raleigh and commend their work to all of you. This organization is doing some amazing work! If you're looking for a place to plug-in or an opportunity to help others even from your own living room (one way to assist is by monitoring Bible correspondence classes that prisoners take), you'll want to check them out. Below is the first in a series of articles submitted by Ann:



For 25 years CLI Prison Alliance (CLI), founded in Raleigh, has remained faithful in its mission to come together in Christ to form an alliance under God to make disciples in prisons. For 10 years Resurrection Lutheran Church members have helped by donating Bibles, Christian books, CDs and DVDs. We have stamped and packed these items at our annual Operation InAsMuch and provided needed office materials at the Christmas in July project. Individuals have contributed monetarily. Our efforts along with churches and businesses, with chaplains and ministry leaders, and with inmates and volunteers have made a spiritual difference in the lives of inmates.

In 2020 alone CLI distributed 301,521 books, Bibles, and evangelistic tracts to hundreds of prisons. It discipled inmates and equipped them to become disciple-makers through its correspondence-based Bible studies (68,936 studies reviewed by 200+ volunteers). It received letters from 4,348 inmates who have come to trust in Jesus.

You are encouraged to find out more about this ministry by checking its website here and by considering how you can learn to do the work God is calling you to do with CLI Prison Alliance. #### Breakaway (9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Grades)


