

Pastor's Corner for Week of July 4-10



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On this Independence Day weekend, it is good to consider the place of national allegiance in our faith life. I love Independence Day and all that is associated with it. Growing up in Richmond, Virginia, the Fourth was a time to head to Dogwood Dell for patriotic songs played by a brass band, a picnic on the stone steps of the amphitheater in Byrd Park, and--of course--fireworks, once the sun went down! No matter how crowded the place was, you'd inevitably see someone you knew from school, church, work, or the neighborhood. Now that I'm a pastor, I can't help but reflect on one place in the Scriptures that seems especially directed at the topic of God-fearing, nation-loving people: 1 Peter 2:16-17: "Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God. Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor" (ESV). It therefore seems fitting that on this July 4th weekend we might hear this Word of God from St. Peter and (1) remember our national leaders in our prayers, (2) honor ALL people (even those whose political views or lifestyles we might disagree with); (3) give thanks to God for the sacrifices of our countrymen and women who have preceded us; (4) cherish the love we receive from, and contribute to the love expressed between members of our own church family, and (5) consider God our one-and-only true King, serving Him (in freedom!) above all others. By the power of the Holy Spirit and the grace of God we have been born into the Kingdom of God. Why not rededicate ourselves as faithful U.S. citizens on this, our nation's birthday?





Vacation Bible School Change

I hope you're all having a good summer! We are approaching our week of VBS quickly.

This year will be unique in that we will meet **Monday, July 12 at 9:00 am** for about one hour in the Family Life Center Gym to kick off the week and to provide you with lessons, crafts, and other resources for you to use to teach your children about God's Creation.

While it will be very different this summer, I think it will be a great opportunity for families to do VBS together throughout the week. You can do it on your own time schedule and include everyone in your family. I am excited about this opportunity and look forward to hearing your stories about how the week worked for your family.



Nursery Care

It is also our hope and intention to get the nursery up and running for all of the Sunday morning services. This will require a good number of volunteers, so that no one has to commit to several hours every week.

We are looking for people that are in high school through any age — grandparents make great nursery workers. We also welcome children 10 and older to be assistants. It is great to have kids willing and able to get down on the floor and play with the younger children.

Sunday School 2021-2022

Before we know it summer will be winding down and it will be time to get back to a more familiar routine. **Sunday School begins the Sunday after Labor Day, September 12.**

We are in the process of choosing curriculum materials and getting people that are willing to be a part of our Sunday School program. We are looking at materials that are easy for non-teachers to teach, curriculum that is Bible-based and age appropriate for the various grades.

We hope to get enough teachers, so we have substitutes and the same one individual will not have to lead the classes every week. We are planning to have a training session and to provide you with all that you need to feel confident that you have what is needed to successfully teach the class. You do not need to be a certified teacher, but rather be someone who loves interacting with children, is familiar with Lutheran doctrine and the Bible, and is willing to share their love for Jesus with the children of RLC.

The plan is to have a joint opening this year prior to the start of class in the Family Life Center for all ages. There will be 15 minutes approximately spent singing and praying together. Following the opening, everyone will go to their appointed classroom. The opening for Sunday School will begin at approximately 9:25 am for the full group and then dismiss at 9:45 am for everyone to go to their classroom. After their individual group time together, classes will dismiss from the classrooms around 10:25 am.


