



Pastor's Corner for Week of July 11-17



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

A recent conversation in our Wednesday evening Bible class on the topics of Law and Gospel in the Scriptures (and how we apply them to our own lives today) coincided with the appointed Psalm for this weekend: Psalm 85. You can read the Psalm here. It came up in talking together that many of the people we know and love tend to imagine that the Bible (especially the Old Testament) is only full of impossible-to-fulfill commandments and images of God's wrath...that it's all Law and no Gospel. We may indeed wonder if that's why folks we know have fallen away from the church over the years. I admit that a "Law" orientation is easy to fall into because our brains are hard-wired to expect rewards for services rendered. The Law is expected. The Gospel takes us by surprise! And as we saw last Wednesday (as we discover from the Psalm this weekend) there is so very much of that surprise not only in the Bible--but in the Old Testament, too. Are there parts of the Bible where we read about Israel's disobedience and the inevitable consequences for their rebellion? Is all of that a pale reflection of our own circumstances more than we care to admit? Of course! But where there is covenant breaking by Israel, there is nevertheless covenant FAITHFULNESS by Israel's God! We read time and time again that God is "gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness" (Exodus 34:6-7, Neh 9:17, Psalm 86:15, 103:8, 145:8...the list goes on). THIS is the reason why the Psalmist says "Let me hear what God the Lord will speak, for he will speak peace to His people" (85:8)! The Gospel was already around in Old Testament times, but was of course fulfilled most completely in Jesus Christ Himself.

On a hot summer day, a cloud can bring relief from the oppressive heat and glare of the sun. A soothing rain shower can make all the difference! There is indeed Gospel "Good News" everywhere in the Bible...even in the Old Testament. No matter what the world might cause us to hear...no matter how that might cause life's journey to seem hard and long at times, the Scriptures are different. There we hear a different voice and encounter refreshment as surprising as a summer shower! "The Lord will speak peace to His people."



Mites for Missions

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) welcomed 2,787 people to the LWML Convention in Lexington, Kentucky, June 24-27, 2021, under the theme "Running the Race ... Looking to Jesus." The convention theme was based on Hebrews 12:1-2.

The voting body adopted a \$2,150,000 mission goal for the 2021-2023 biennium. This goal, by the grace of God, will fund 28 mission grants as women and men respond in prayer and mites (offerings) during the next two years. The following grants were chosen:

J.P. serves the Cambodia Lutheran Church (CLC), a growing collection of Lutheran congregations. J.P. travels throughout Cambodia to equip and empower the leaders of the CLC with informal mentorship and formal theological education, that
