Pastor's Corner for Week of July 25-31

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As I thought about the appointed Old Testament reading for this week I couldn't help noticing how different the Bible would be without Noah, without the animals, without the ark...and especially, without the rainbow. For ancient people, floods and tsunamis were a sign of primordial chaos. At a time when the meteorological predictions of supercomputers and the severe weather warnings on our smart phones were unknown, natural calamities would have seemed even more terrifying than they do today! It's no wonder then, that many ancient peoples have depicted the gods as divine warriors with archery weapons in tow. Are the bows and arrows of the gods directed, in the end, at us? Without the Biblical account containing Noah and the ark God commanded him to build, we might always wonder. Without the rainbow after that terrible flood, we might think the chaos of the physical world actually WINS. We might be tempted to think that the positive pathology report or the unwanted biopsy result is God's final and definitive word. But then there's that rainbow. And the rainbow demonstrates that the archer's weapon is unstrung and pointed —not toward earth—but away. There's that rainbow: a sign of God's covenant, God's promise, that the entire natural world was not only something to be created...but cared for. That the giving of life...AND the extending of life...are both gifts from God's hand.

The best news of all, of course, is that the God of the rainbow is also the God of the cross and empty tomb. No matter what you are facing today that might overwhelm and defeat you, take heart that Jesus has turned the biggest defeat of all into victory! This day and every day is a day made new. Christ...is...risen.

Greetings, Resurrection Family,

Some of you associated with our school may already have gotten the word that I have been issued, and accepted, a Call to the Southeastern District LCMS to the role of Facilitator for School, Youth, and Family Ministries. This would allow me to work with the 79 Lutheran School ministries of our District (which stretches from South Carolina to Southern Pennsylvania). This is a big commitment of time and involves considerable travel within this district and would not allow me to continue in my current role as Principal of Resurrection Lutheran School. This is not a role I sought out, but the officers of our District nominated me for this position. After prayerful reflection and consideration, I determined that this new role is what God is calling me to fulfill. And though I am excited to take on this new calling, I am sad to be leaving my position as Principal at RLS in August. I appreciate your prayers for me in this new role for the Lutheran Church.

I will not be leaving RLS in an administrative "lurch" though. Not only have I been working diligently to fill any teaching vacancies, but on contingencies of my leaving. The RLS Board of Directors has approved my proposal to ask Bob Unger to be the Interim Principal for RLS for the upcoming school year.

Bob is a thoroughly trained Lutheran Educator who has experience as an Interim Principal. He served for more than a year in that very role earlier in his career. He is well known and respected in our school community. I believe he would bring the "gravitas" needed to help keep the ship directed over the next transition period. He is already on staff at RLS as a part-time instructor and his duties would simply shift to administrative, rather than instructional. This would not require more time than he already has been spending on duties for RLS and would not require any modifications to his role as Director of Music Ministries at RLC. This would be a one year, interim position and one of the first jobs for the new administration and RLS Board of Directors would be to start a search for the next full-time administrator for the school. I would be assisting in this search in my new role as Facilitator as well.

I thank you for your partnership throughout the years of my administration (14 years...wow) at RLS and look forward to working with Resurrection in my new role for the District. I promise to not be a stranger and will always look at my time at Resurrection Lutheran with great fondness.

CLI Prison Ministries Service Opportunity



You have no doubt seen invitations to serve CLI, an organization based right here in Raleigh, in the past. I'd like to include the following article by RLC member Ann Johnson as another reminder that this worthy organization is making a difference. What follows is especially timely in light of the Seminary Speaker Series event that is coming up. Enjoy!

The Power of the Book

A few weeks ago we celebrated our country's independence founded on the basis of religious freedom. How often do we think of those who do not have that privilege? The following was printed in a recent CLI newsletter and shows how precious is that right to believe and worship as we choose.

Zhirko was born in Iraq and raised by parents who were deeply religious Muslims. After 12th grade he met American Christian missionaries who invited him to church and to Bible studies in their home. He accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior but kept this belief secret because he knew his family would disapprove.

The family found revealing pictures stored on his computer and asked, "How could you convert to Christianity? God will never forgive you. You are possessed by a Christian demon." His uncle slapped and beat him while his parents stood by watching. His cousins took him to their house, beat the bottoms of his feet to hurt the demon so it would leave, and read the Koran out loud to him for several days. He would not back down and fled from family and country to follow God's will for his life.

During the next two years he learned to survive in Central and South America and finally entered the United States in February 2019. For nine months he was held in San Diego at Ofay Mesa Detention Center where he first learned of CLI in a book with a stamp inside that challenged him to write and enroll in their Bible studies. He experienced the Lord's presence often while working through each lesson. In October 2019 he was released and granted religious asylum to stay in the United States. Zhirko writes, "CLI, I encourage you to keep on doing the will of our Heavenly Father, and one day you will hear Him say, 'Well done!"

You can place donations of Christian books and Bibles in the container by the coat rack and the mailboxes. There is something else you can do that may have a greater impact: YOU CAN BECOME A CLI BIBLE STUDY MINISTER. You can do this entirely in your own home. You review the lesson an inmate has worked on and returned to CLI, which then is sent to you for comments and encouraging remarks. You send the lesson back to the inmate in a stamped, addressed envelope so he or she can benefit from your feedback. CLI provides resources for you to use in reviewing each lesson (there are 35). Bible Study Ministers feel blessed more by what they receive than by what they give. Isn't that awesome?
