Pastor's Corner for Week of August 1-7



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

How much is enough? Over the next few weeks we will be discovering what the Scriptures tell us about God's feeding of our hungry hearts. This week's focus is on God's mercy and Israel's grumbling. Yes, that's right: God's *giving* in spite of Israel's *complaining*.

Suffice to say that nobody likes listening to complaining. Complainers are most often shushed into silence, talked over, or simply ignored. In this season of summer roadtrips I picture to myself Moms and Dads, hungry and tired themselves, hearing the urgent cries from the back seat: "Aren't we there yet?" "What's taking so long?" "I'm hungry!" "Is there a bathroom nearby?" A weary silence or impatient demand for "quiet" might seem at first the easiest response! Our heavenly Father's reaction to the complaint about lack of food...His response to Israel's hankering for Egypt, the place of her former bondage...is different. Israel's complaint stirs the response in God to *listen*. Israel's grumbling becomes the trigger in Israel's God to *act*. The result? Not rescue from the wilderness but the gift of manna and meat in the wilderness so that Israel might be sustained in the desert and live. God would not abandon Israel to its grumbling. God, in God's mercy, would act so that the truly hungry might be fed.

The complaint that something needed is not enough, the desire to return to an earlier, less complicated time, and the fear of what the future may hold are certainly not limited to this brief passage from the early pages of the Scriptures. The same has held true across the centuries and even into our present day. The Good News for you and me is that the God of Exodus 20 continues to provide for our needs even though WHAT He provides and HOW He provides it may take us by surprise! In the end, God's mercy transforms mere complaining to thriving--even in life's wilderness places. In the end, the real Bread God would rain down from heaven would not be mere manna--bread that perishes--but the Bread of Life, Jesus Christ.

We find the satisfaction of our soul's hunger in Jesus again today, no matter where our wilderness journey might take us!

As always, here is a bit of news to read this week:

Recent CDC Guidance for Face Coverings and Worship at RLC

You have no doubt heard that due to a lower than expected rate of vaccination in the United States and the resulting proliferation of dangerous variants of the COVID virus, the CDC has updated its guidance for face coverings. In areas where there is an average of more than 50 new infections per 100,000 residents over the previous seven days (or more than 8 percent of tests are positive for infection over that period), everyone, regardless of whether or not he/she is fully vaccinated, is strongly encouraged to wear a mask. As your pastor, I constantly seek to discern where God is leading us to worship both freely AND safely. At the moment, new COVID cases in Wake County average around 10 new cases a day per 100,000 people and the rate of infection is 5.5% (see <u>covidactnow.org</u> figures for Wake County). Though no one is less enthusiastic than yours truly regarding the prospect of once again masking up at RLC, should the numbers continue to worsen, it is inevitable that masks for all worshippers will once again be required and some events will be cancelled. I urge you to do all you can to encourage the unvaccinated you know and love who are able to do so to get the vaccine. Please continue to monitor my weekly email and regular church announcements for changes to current practices.

Greetings, Resurrection Family,

Some of you associated with our school may already have gotten the word that I have been issued, and accepted, a Call to the Southeastern District LCMS to the role of Facilitator for School, Youth, and Family Ministries. This would allow me to work with the 79 Lutheran School ministries of our District (which stretches from South Carolina to Southern Pennsylvania). This is a big commitment of time and involves considerable travel within this district and would not allow me to continue in my current role as Principal of Resurrection Lutheran School. This is not a role I sought out, but the officers of our District nominated me for this position. After prayerful reflection and consideration, I determined that this new role is what God is calling me to fulfill. And though I am excited to take on this new calling, I am sad to be leaving my position as Principal at RLS in August. I appreciate your prayers for me in this new role for the Lutheran Church.

I will not be leaving RLS in an administrative "lurch" though. Not only have I been working diligently to fill any teaching vacancies, but on contingencies of my leaving. The RLS Board of Directors has approved my proposal to ask Bob Unger to be the Interim Principal for RLS for the upcoming school year.

Bob is a thoroughly trained Lutheran Educator who has experience as an Interim Principal. He served for more than a year in that very role earlier in his career. He is well known and respected in our school community. I believe he would bring the "gravitas" needed to help keep the ship directed over the next transition period. He is already on staff at RLS as a part-time instructor and his duties would simply shift to administrative, rather than instructional. This would not require more time than he already has been spending on duties for RLS and would not require any modifications to his role as Director of Music Ministries at RLC. This would be a one year, interim position and one of the first jobs for the new administration and RLS Board of Directors would be to start a search for the next full-time administrator for the school. I would be assisting in this search in my new role as Facilitator as well.

I thank you for your partnership throughout the years of my administration (14 years...wow) at RLS and look forward to working with Resurrection in my new role for the District. I promise to not be a stranger and will always look at my time at Resurrection Lutheran with great fondness.
