Pastor Jonathan's Corner for Week of August 8-14

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It's back-to-school season. What a great time to consider what "a real education" means and entails for followers of Jesus.

Everyone knows that learning neither begins in the classroom...nor ends when you get your diploma. Learning is lifelong. In the book *Hector and the Search for Happiness*, Hector is a psychiatrist who decides to go on a world-wide quest to learn the secret of happiness. Hector travels from Paris to China to Africa to the United States. In his interactions with a quirky set of characters he strives to learn what happiness is. "Many people only see happiness in their future," Hector discovers and records in his journal. Or on another occasion: "Happiness often comes when least expected." Some of Hector's insights are delightfully in-the-moment: "Happiness is a long walk in beautiful, unfamiliar mountains." Others are more philosophical: "It's a mistake to think that happiness is the goal." It's easy to grow weary of Hector's common-sense "discoveries." But the point is...he's a guy who wants something more important than head knowledge. He wants a real education.

In our Gospel reading for this weekend, Jesus touches on where real education begins, a theme woven into the Hebrew Bible long, long, before Jesus' earthly ministry: God, the Lord of Israel, is the ultimate Teacher (John 6:45; cf. Isaiah 54:13). God's teaching is different from how we usually construe education today. "Real education" in the Scriptures is not a matter of going to the right school or sitting at the feet of the most celebrated teacher. It isn't only or especially for *children*. Real education has to do with learning about a God of mercy who no longer remembered the sins of His people but leads the humble in what is right (Psalm 25: 6-9). It wasn't—and isn't—only a quest to learn about real happiness. But it has more to do with Hector's search than it does with the guy who sits at home with all the right answers! The Good News is that Jesus is not only our Teacher...He is our loving Savior, the One to whom all sinners who seek the mercy of Almighty God are drawn, by the Father. What a blessing that there is a never a vacation from that kind of learning! There are many opportunities at Resurrection to continue to get a real education from Jesus... and to encourage others to do the same...as we gather around the Word of God in Bible study, fellowship, and our devotional life. Let's make the adventure of lifelong learning a part of our time together at RLC.

We will see what James has to say about living in a Chirstian community and how we are used by God there to build each other up for service. 

Real life can be a real mess.



Our family landed in Phnom Penh safe and sound on July 27. Currently, all traveller's arriving in Cambodia must undergo a two-week quarantine at a government chosen hotel. There is no way to choose or even know which hotel you go to. After presenting our negative result from a test taken 72 hours before departure, and then having our required COVID-19 test on arrival, we were put on a "mystery bus" to our assigned hotel. We had heard horror stories of travelers in dirty hotels with no windows and low quality food. Praise God, we were taken to a very clean and comfortable hotel (get a tour from Isaac here!) only minutes from our house. From our 10th floor balcony, you can see our neighborhood (see pic a)! Deily meals are compulsory and provided by the hotel; no outside deliveries allowed.

a): <u>Daily meals</u> are compulsory and provided by the notel; no outside deliveries allowed. While the food is a bit repetitive (see pic b, a typical breakfast comprising stir-fried noodles, boiled sweet potato, hard-boiled egg, bread and fruit), we are thankful that it is abundant and tasty. Nonetheless, we are glad we packed plenty of food and snacks to supplement. We decided the best way to combat boredom was to stick to a routine. <u>Our daily schedule</u> includes two devotional times, two <u>exercise times</u>, and plenty of opportunities for play and crafts (see pic c for Celeste and Bella's robotics project; video

here). We are very grateful for a friend and supporter who mailed us several kid-friendly games that pack well. Isaac especially loves game time (pic d)! We will test for COVID-19 on August 10. We should be able to leave quarantine a day or two thereafter, upon receiving a negative test result. But even after quarantine, we will be entering a city that is itself going through <u>another round of lockdowns</u> due to a surge in COVID-19 cases. **Please pray** for our family as we endure quarantine, but even more **please pray** for Cambodia. **Pray** that new cases would soon subside. Please also **pray** for the economic effects of the lockdowns — another blow in a country whose economy is very vulnerable and has already weathered much. **Please pray** that in these hard times many might know the comfort and abiding presence of Jesus.
