From the Pastor

When "More" Can Never Satisfy

(Ecclesiastes 5:8-10; 2 Corinthians 9:7)

Juli and I had the opportunity to have some time away this past month. Many thanks to Pastor Zach and to those who filled in (Pastor Jim Stoltenberg, Mark and Megan Mantey, Bob Hirt) for me during our absence! One of the things that vacationing pastors get to do when they visit other congregations is see how others do ministry. I was happy to have the chance to visit a seminary classmate in action at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Riverside, California a couple of weeks ago. On the Sunday that we visited, Pastor Stephen Borst was talking about the spirituality of money and abundance. He invoked an image from the movie "All the Money in the World" that depicts J. Paul Getty being asked "How much would it take to make you feel secure?" Getty (the richest or certainly one of the richest people in the world at that time) answered: "More!" That image stands in stark contrast to the life lived according to God's plan for us, though we live in a world bombarded with the message that having lots of money/ possessions will lead to becoming happier or more loved.

Time and time again the Scriptures demonstrate that true joy is not found in acquiring or keeping "more." It is, instead, the Spirit-enabled life of moving from acquiring to giving, from fearfulness to faith, from an attitude of scarcity to an attitude of abundance...or from a perception of ourselves as "owners" to an understanding of how we are merely "stewards" of what God has entrusted to us during the days we enjoy here together. We get it wrong so often. But as King Solomon in the Old Testament and St. Paul in the New put it, Godgiven joy is the key to approaching the good things in life as our Creator intended. Solomon discourages an attitude toward wealth that longs to cling to possessions from cradle to grave, writing,

Prophets Pointing to Jesus



You might have heard this phrase before, "The whole Bible is about Jesus" or "all of Scripture points to Jesus" but phrases like that can raise a lot of questions. In what way does it really all point to Jesus? When we read parts of the Bible, especially the Old Testament, it can be hard to see Jesus in some of the stories. That is the topic we look forward to tackling in our upcoming Sunday morning Bible Study!

As we are heading towards
Advent and the celebration
of our Savior's birth, we will look
at some of the Old Testament
prophets and how they pointed
to Jesus' birth. Throughout the
study, we will also look at
the historical context of these
particular prophets to help us
better understand why this
message of a Savior was so
important for them and why it
is still important for us today.

This new class, team led by Pastors Jonathan and Zach, will be held Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:30 am. It will run **November 7**-December 19, with no class held on November 28 or December 12.

No need to register, just plan to attend in Room 240, Family Life Center. "When God gives someone wealth and possessions, and the ability to enjoy them, to accept their lot and be happy in their toil—this is a gift of God" (Eccl. 5:9). St. Paul advocates on behalf of the poor in Jerusalem, encouraging the Corinthian Christians to give generously to the believers there—but to do so from an attitude of cheerfulness (2 Cor. 9:7)—not compulsion. The Corinthian Christians could take heart that their sacrifice would lead others to glorify God (9:13).

I mention all of this because the time of our congregation's Pledge Weekend event is coming around again: November 13-14. We invite you to take part by either picking up a pledge card when you are in church November 6-7 to submit in person, or else submitting a pledge online here: rlcary.org/ ministries/stewardship-weekend. The purpose of your pledge is not for our own church budgeting or fundraising efforts. It is for your own Christian walk. No matter how you submit your pledge, it will be completely confidential. I also believe it will encourage you to embrace the joy of Christian discipleship that only God can give! I have learned over the last two years that RLC is a generous congregation. We strive to serve God with the time, talent, and treasure that has been entrusted to us. If you are not currently serving in any particular ministry area at RLC, yet desire to do so, please reach out to any one of our pastoral staff or to the church office. We will get you connected! As we begin this month, we do so with the knowledge that the desire for "more" can never truly satisfy. With glad and thankful hearts for all that God has already done for us—and continues to provide—we dedicate a portion of what we have for the work of God's Kingdom at RLC.

Last month, I wrote about the Stephen Ministry program to announce an upcoming training class. This month, in the spirit of the Thanksgiving holiday, I would like to give thanks to our Stephen Leaders and Stephen Ministers across RLC who serve in this very important ministry. Some people need someone to talk to for a couple of weeks while others meet for months. Our Stephen Ministry team walks beside those who need someone to help push through "life events" when it can seem difficult to walk alone. Thank you, team! I know the impact this ministry can have on people and I know the hard work you've done to become certified and then meet with those in need. It's a "behind the scenes" ministry that others don't often see but I am here to share your impact on serving and loving our neighbors. Thank you for your dedication to the ministry.

And now, as we wind down 2021 and get ready to jump into 2022, we're looking for people to consider joining our team. To introduce what we do, we've set an upcoming Sunday School class beginning on November 7. If you want to "dip your toe in the water" to learn more about Christian caregiving, this class is the way to do it.

We will be going through the book, *Christian Caregiving: A Way of Life* by Kenneth Haugk, a pastor and clinical psychologist who is the founder of the Stephen Series (Stephen Ministry). This course will help you discover ways to become a distinctively Christian caregiver and be a great resource regardless of whether you continue with the Stephen Ministry certification. The class starts November 7 at 9:30 am and runs for 6 weeks in Room 251.

If you like what you see in that study, I encourage you to take the next step and enroll in the certification class starting January 2022. But... one step at a time... consider the Sunday school and reach out to us to RSVP, so we can plan on the number of books we'll need.

Christmas Store

Would you like to help provide presents for children in need this Christmas?

The Christmas Store provides financially-challenged parents with an appointment to choose free toys for their children, age 14 and under. Families living in Apex, Holly Springs, Willow Spring, Cary, Fuquay-Varina, Morrisville, or New Hill are referred by local aid organizations or school counselors.

Typically, partner organizations ask their patrons, members, and customers to donate new toys for toddlers to teens and deliver them back to their location or to directly to United Church in Apex, which hosts the store.

At Resurrection Lutheran Church, we place Christmas trees with gift tags in the Narthex and Family Life Center. Please pick up a tag, purchase the item, then place the unwrapped toy with tag attached back under the tree.
