From the Pastor

A Season to Get Real

(John 16:33; Psalm 139:11-12)

March 2022 coincides with a season of the church year that moves us from the bright daylight of Jesus’ revelations (e.g., His glory shown through miracles) to places where that light is hidden from view: Jesus’ time of temptation in the wilderness, His grief over those who rejected His message, His story of a waiting father’s worry for a wayward son...and ultimately, of course, the unjust arrest, trial, and crucifixion of the holy Son of God. If there were ever the temptation to pretend our faith journey travels a road that somehow avoids pain, suffering, and disappointment, this season of the church year (Lent) pulls us up short and forces us to “get real.” I write this article on a day that the Russian Federation has swept into Ukraine, where the destruction and toll of war on the people of this country are only beginning to be felt. Lent gives us every reason not to avert our gaze when tragedy and human suffering in the world—or our own corner of it—occurs. The Christian faith, by the power of the crucified yet risen Son of God, takes an honest inventory of what is going on in the world and in our own hearts. This season of Lent is a time to find strength in the God of hidden glory, the God of the cross and tomb, the God who shares in our suffering and has overcome the world so that we might enjoy peace that the world will never be able to give (John 16:33).

Midweek Wednesday and Sunday morning worship in March will focus our attention there. Following Ash Wednesday services on March 2 at 8:45 AM and 7:00 PM, our midweek services at 6:00 PM are organized around the theme “Though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good” (Genesis 50:20). Every Wednesday, from March 9 to April 6, we will read portions of the biblical account of Jesus’ Passion as recorded in the Gospel of Luke and consider how God uses

these events in the life of Jesus for our benefit today. Then on Sunday mornings we will consider the hidden victories of Jesus over sin, death, and the Devil—and how Jesus' victory is our strength. It is a strength that leads us to repentance and the renewed assurance that our sins are forgiven. Get ready for services in the month of March that will be full of activity: Lutheran Schools Week March 6-13, culminating in RLS youth choir in the 11:00 AM service March 13; Reception of New Members on March 20; a fundraiser for the National Youth Gathering on the weekends of March 12/13 and 19/20; and the first of several faith statements presented by our 2022 crop of RLC confirmands.

We worship the crucified and risen Christ, a Savior who knows both suffering AND glory. If we were to somehow believe the Christian faith is supposed to be a never-ending "mountaintop moment," we would be fooling ourselves. We would end up denying the cross of Jesus and living as if the world's darkness did not truly exist. The Good News, of course, is that the Lord of the mountaintop also traversed the valley of the shadow of death—with us! As the Psalmist writes: "You have searched me, Lord, and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways... If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast. If I say, 'Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me,' even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you" (139:11-12).

A phrase from a recent question considered in my daily devotions this past week comes back to my mind today: "Are we more comfortable with the 'glorified' Jesus or the 'suffering' Jesus? When I talk with Jesus [in prayer], which Jesus am I picturing?"

The season of Lent is a reminder that the Jesus of the glorious empty tomb—and the Jesus of the blood-stained cross—are both in focus for us as Christians. Let's not pretend that suffering isn't real. We give thanks the God of glory knows our suffering. And we praise God that in our suffering, we will always know the strength of the One who is truly there!

Short Story

This month I wanted to share a short story about Leslie, a single mother who found herself struggling with food insecurity for the first time in 1990. To view the full story, click [here](#).

It was 1990 and newly divorced, single mother Leslie left an abusive relationship with two little girls in hand but nothing else. She had no money, left behind a great career, the beautiful home she had built, and her family and friends since high school — her whole life history, left behind, to keep herself and her children safe. Although that dangerous situation was behind her, her little family faced another hardship: hunger. "It is humiliating to know you have no choice but to ask for help — especially when your family were givers. But when you are there, you just bite your tongue, lower your head, and do it," Leslie says now, reflecting back on that time. However, it was the holiday season and with so many expenses of moving to a new state, she found herself needing to ask for help. So, that is what Leslie did. She reached out to her nearest food bank and got what she needed for herself and children.

Due to the devastating impact of COVID-19, the Food Bank saw a staggering increase of about 11% in need over the last year, approximately 588,240 people who didn't always know where their next meal would come from. A lot of those people had also never faced hunger before. As you can see the effects of COVID-19 are still being felt by many of the families that we serve, therefore thank you for helping us provide the food and resources to help these families in need.

The Food Bank relies on our volunteers, especially in times of crisis. On top of our standard, daily, safety and hygiene processes, we have several additional measures in place to protect volunteers and staff. 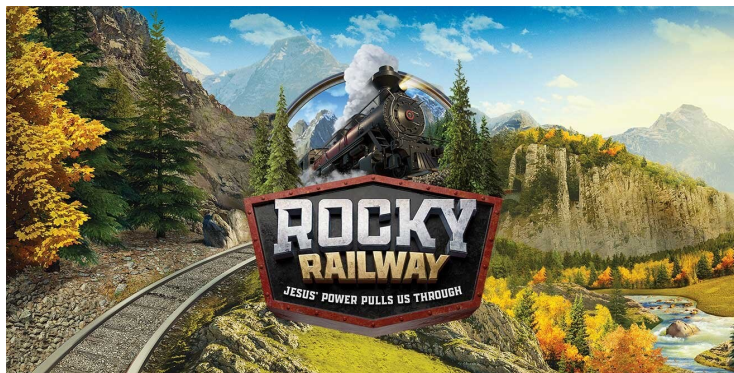
