From the Pastor

Running the Race to Win

(John 20:19-29; 1 Timothy 4:7-8)

Scars are testimony that the body has vanquished a potential threat. They are worn by survivors and usually imply there's an important story somewhere to be told. April 2022, containing both Good Friday and Easter Sunday, is all about scars, the ultimate Survivor who wears them, and the story of salvation we gather to share together again this year. The scars in question remain on the resurrected body of One who suffered death by crucifixion. The "Survivor," though His is



no ordinary survival of a life prolonged, is of course, Jesus! And the story that Jesus' scars tell is a true story of how the Son of God underwent death itself to win the world's salvation. He ran the race that we cannot—He lived in perfect obedience to the Father and gave up His life in love for the world—conquering sin, death, and

the Devil once and for all. He ran the race of life to win! Now all who share in that victory by faith in Jesus can one day say, together with St. Paul: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing." Easter fuels our desire to run and finish the race. The scars that Jesus bears on His resurrected body demonstrate that all who live and die in Him not only finish that race...but will one day finish and win that contest.

Thanks to your efforts and support of our community in the month of March, RLC has once again been running the race to win, this year!

April 2022 at Resurrection Lutheran Church sees us returning to several beloved traditions that had been on hold, due to COVID.

- RLC youth celebrating their First Communion will take part in an in-person Christian Seder on April 6, prior to their first reception of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday (April 14).
- Food and Fellowship for the Blind resumes monthly activity on April 22.
- Finally, at the end of the month, our congregation's confirmands and their families will gather again for a banquet on April 27, prior to their Confirmation Rite on May 1.

I can't tell you how grateful I am for all of the volunteers who make these events possible. Though for some of us these events might be new, it is so much fun for many of us to get back into a more familiar routine.

In April, Pastor Zach and I will also begin a new sermon series on the book of Revelation entitled "A New Song to Sing." Revelation is often misunderstood and misinterpreted. It is sometimes seen merely as a book containing storm clouds that portend "End Time" events. The reality is different. In fact, the word "Revelation" in its original usage has to do with pulling away a curtain and seeing things as they are...TRULY are...not just some day in the future, but right now. And the picture we get when we look at what Revelation is a picture of the people of God "running the race" as St. Paul did, striving to give faithful witness to Life while living in a world that often does not make that race easy...even when life leaves us a little scarred and battered.

A Nike commercial from several years back depicts athletes with the scars of various injuries. A surfer bearing the marks of a shark bite. A hockey player with a front tooth missing when he smiles. A boxer with cauliflower ears. Each athlete appears to the tune of Joe Cocker's "You Are So Beautiful...to Me," a montage that finishes with the Nike swoosh. No explanation is given. The implied message is that all of these folks are survivors...they continue to engage in their individual sports despite very real challenges. Our resurrected Lord Jesus, who bears the mortal wounds of the cross, now lives! He ran the race and won it, for us. Together with the saints in heaven we praise our God in our words and actions. Because of all that Jesus did to win the race, we run the race confident in the victor's crown that awaits each of us, too.

Christ is risen, Alleluia! He is risen indeed! Pastor Jonathan

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod's Birthday

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod celebrates its birthday on **April 26**. Initial members, which included 12 pastors representing 14 congregations from Illinois, Indiana, Missouri, Michigan, New York and Ohio, signed the church body's constitution on April 26, 1847, at First Saint Paul Lutheran Church in Chicago, Illinois. Originally named The German Evangelical Lutheran Synod of Missouri, Ohio and Other States, the name was shortened to The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod in 1947 on the occasion of our 100th anniversary. The roots of the LCMS run deep, tracing back to Saxon and other German immigrants establishing a new church body in America, seeking the freedom to practice and follow confessional Lutheranism.
