From the Pastor

From One Beggar to Another

(Galatians 3:27-28)

Recently I was having a conversation about the polarized nature of our society, a matter that impacts even the church. "What can we do to bring people together?" the question was asked. I thought of some answers. Administer a survey that identifies the most popular topics... and then develop a Bible study around it? Come up with new "front porch ministries" (fun events at church that get a variety of people in the door)? Do all we can to get more "views" on our YouTube channel and more "likes" on our Facebook page? The list of possibilities seemed limitless. The problem? Each of those possibilities, when held up to the light of day, seemed truly LESS than satisfying.

Then it occurred to me: once the Holy Spirit guides us to see the common mission we are ALL called to—sharing the love of God in Christ Jesus, by our words and actions, with others—we start to move



away from what distinguishes one part of the Body of Christ from another and toward working more and more together. St. Paul reminds us, "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is

neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Ever seen in yourself the issue of what I call "Pharisee Identification Syndrome"? (I have.) This is when you judge someone else for being, well, too judgmental! You see the problem. If a Pharisee is a "self-righteous person" (Oxford Dictionary) and we feel better about ourselves because we're "not like that Pharisee over there," then we're not really any better than the folks we're judging. Better to dive in and get to work together than spend a lot of time noticing how

In 2022-2023, in addition to our involvement in leading RLS and RLP chapels Pastor Zach and I will also be helping out in the Middle School classroom. (Pastor Zach especially, will be teaching 8th Grade religion three days a week.) What a blessing our schools are to RLC!
- Increased recognition of the gifts God has given us to engage the
 nations of the world with the love of God in Christ. How is this
 happening? Plans are underway for an upcoming mission trip to
 Uganda in 2023 sponsored by registered non-profit Life for Uganda.
 The team, led by RLC members Cheryl and Jeff Fike, will be visiting
 our partners in the Lutheran Church of Uganda in 2023 and serving
 in the Amudat region with social ministry projects that further the

- Multiplication of service projects, servant events, and the establishing of serving communities that allow "not-yet Christian" friends working alongside us at RLC to encounter the God who loves them in Christ Jesus. How is this happening? In addition to the many opportunities for service at RLC, plans are underway to introduce a new organization to our church community this October: Lutherans for Life. Pastor Jeff Duncan will visit RLC October 15-16 and present a workshop on Saturday, the 15th for anyone wanting to join a LFL Life Team at RLC. This could involve:
 - Serving expecting mothers needing extra support for unplanned pregnancies
 - ♦ Finding help for folks struggling with suicidal ideation
 - Working to enhance the quality of life for people who are nearing the end of life here on earth.

We might all live life from time to time like Pharisees. But we are ALL, in the end, just beggars directing other beggars like us to the One who has life-giving food. That's our purpose. That's what our life together here is all about.

From one missionary to another: I give thanks to God for our differences. It's a joy to be in this together!

I can't wait to see what new things God will grow through us.

Bible Study Opportunity


Monday Night Women's Bible Study
