#### From the Pastor

### The Lord Will Watch Over Your Coming and Going

(Psalm 121)

I recently saw the televised moment the casket of Queen Elizabeth II was brought inside St. George's Chapel in Windsor for her committal service. At that very moment a choir sang the words of Psalm 121, one of those "Psalms of Ascent" in the psalter expressing the joy of worshippers approaching Jerusalem to worship in the Lord's house. That psalm has memories attached, for me. A sung version of it happened to be on a movie soundtrack I bought as a college student



because I like Pat Metheney, the lead musician featured on that soundtrack. It was reinforced when I heard another version of it chosen by the choir director and sung by the choir of my church at that time while our pastor's wife underwent treatment for cancer. I've spoken its message aloud

many times as a pastor when travel mercies are requested or God's protection for family members is petitioned. And the psalm's message came full circle in more recent years when I received a greeting card with its text printed inside its cover not long after Juli and I moved to a new church location. The psalm expresses in poetic terms the watchful eye of our loving God on our busy life activities... whether we are arriving or departing, coming or going: "Behold, He who watches over Israel will neither slumber no sleep... the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore." It is as appropriate for a child's first day of school as it is for a monarch being laid to rest.





#### **Blessing of the Quilts and Silent Auction**

The **weekend of October 8-9** at all of our worship services, we will be celebrating the Blessing of the Quilts. Come see the hand-tied quilts The Piecemakers, RLC's quilting group, put together this year. The quilts will be blessed, then shipped to Lutheran World Relief (LWR). Quilts are valuable tools in LWR's relief work to end poverty, injustice, and human suffering. To recipients, they are a symbol of God's love and compassion. Quilts can be used as warm bedding, room dividers, simple tents, or floor coverings. LWR distributed its first quilts in 1945 to families in war-torn Europe following the Second World War. Today, an average of 300,000 quilts are lovingly given worldwide each year.

Also that weekend is the Silent Auction Fundraiser for The Piecemakers to buy the needed materials to continue making quilts for Lutheran World Relief and Sleep in Heavenly Peace.



There will be a variety of quality, hand-made quilt products that are perfect for gift giving in the upcoming season, think birthdays, baby showers, and Christmas! Auction items include an heirloom quality, queen size quilt (shown left) and a variety of themed items, such as throws, totes, baby items, table and bed runners.

You are invited to view and enter your bid on the items on display in the Narthex and Family Life Center before or after all services on October 8-9. Bid sheets will then be picked up and winners contacted for delivery and payment. Each item will have a bid sheet identifying the suggested market value and minimum bid.

#### **Sleep in Heavenly Peace**

First priority is providing beds for children who are sleeping in compromised situations. That may mean on the floor, on a pile of blankets, or on a couch. A volunteer crew delivered to a family of 3 little girls that had all been sleeping on the same (broken) twin size bed. That same night a bed was delivered to a 17-year-old that had never had a bed of his own.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace provides the bed, mattress, and bedding to each child. Bedlessness is a real problem in the US with 2-3% of the population sleeping without beds. Two questions are asked of the applicants: is the child over 3 and under 18 years, and do they currently not have a bed. Volunteer builds sponsored by local churches, businesses, and individuals have built and delivered more than 60,000 beds in the US.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace provides all the tools and expertise that allow people with little or no experience to build all the components for a solid, wood bunk bed. It is always a fun-filled half day that ends with branding the beds. The fellowship is wonderful and the ability to solve a problem for others leaves everyone feeling a bit better about the world!

RLC will be sponsoring a Sleep in Heavenly Peace Build Day on **Saturday, November 5 from 9:00 am-1:00 pm** in the church parking lot. Mark your calendars! We will need 50 volunteers for the build.

Oh, those texting teens! One common picture of youth today often includes a phone in their hand. No matter what they are doing, their "lifeline" is always within reach. As adults, we ourselves must be "connected." In My position, I see and address cell phone use all the time. It was at this summer's LCMS Youth Gathering, God opened my eyes to a bigger picture. We needed to use our phones quite a bit. It's how we stayed connected as a group knowing where and when to meet, it's how we found out what sessions were happening and when, where food was, and of course which color shirt to wear for the day.

However, I wasn't ready to be taught about the next new thing. Of course, there is TikTok, SnapChat, Instagram and the list goes on making me roll my eyes as a parent and youth director. I got a lesson about a new fad: BeReal app. The idea being that you get this app and it will alert you to a 2 minute window to take a picture of what you are doing in those two minutes. No filters. Just an authentic picture of what you are doing. You can



add captions, but the picture itself is supposed to be taken and posted. So in the middle of Flame's (LCMS Christian rap artist) amazing testimony during a mass event, I start seeing phones come out and the youth posting their BeReal before the time ran out. At first, I was embarrassed and a little upset that they weren't totally invested but what I found out was something much bigger. As the BeReal authentic pictures were taken, captions were made claiming where they were, how awesome Flame was, excitement and praise to attend an

LCMS gathering. Witnessing in a pure and authentic way that was true to them and could be appreciated by those that follow them. Embracing and claiming their faith posting for all of their peers to see.

On September 18, I got to see the power of utilizing that which we fear takes us away from our focus again. Our high school youth group, Breakaway, participated in a Zoom and Kahoot with 95 LCMS churches and 286

youth from across the country. All of whom had also attended the Gathering. They started in prayer, had devotional time with some of the amazing speakers from that week, and just had fun. Here's what I saw: youth investing in their church relationship, having fun with others who share a common faith and belief System, and building connections with each other. Isn't that what we want for our youth?


