Pastor's Corner for October 9-15

"Lord, Have Mercy" (Luke 17:11-19; 2 Timothy 2:1-13)

You and I might not know what it's like to be a leper. But I imagine we've all had an inkling of what it means to come to the end of our own self-help "rope" and say, "Jesus... have mercy!" That's what the ten men in our Gospel reading for this weekend did. As I watched the news reports about the impact of Hurricane Ian in southwest Florida recently and saw interviews with people who had lost (in their words) "everything," all I could think of at first were the first words on record of these ten men in our Gospel reading: "Jesus... Lord... have mercy!"

Thank God we have One who hears our prayers and though He may not always

rescue us out of our circumstances as we would like, He is gracious and merciful beyond our wildest imagining! As Jesus saw the lepers in the Gospel accounts and had compassion on them, as He knew they needed love and healing, as He talked with them, healed them, and got closer to them than anyone else would... He knows our needs today and redeems our hearts, souls, and —yes, either now or in the world to come— our bodies, too.

Gratitude comes as the result of God's saving work for us and in us. Jesus heals the men of our text today not because of their gratitude but because of His mercy. Jesus acted first. Gratitude came later.

I've told the story before about an Okinawan Christian that Juli and I knew, whose name was Hidechika Komatsu. Mr. Komatsu was the organist at our church in Okinawa. He had been a child on a small island in the northern part of the Okinawan archipelago during the latter part of World War 2, an island that had to be evacuated as the war drew near. Once upon a time I asked Mr. Komatsu how he had come to faith. He told me he would never forget as the residents of a leper colony on his island were evacuated by Roman Catholic nuns, how the sisters embraced these "untouchable" people. "As boys, me and my friends would throw stones over the wall to their compound," he explained. "These women hugged them as they put them on the boat. That was my first introduction to how the Christian faith was different." As the war ended and the Okinawan people cried out to God for mercy in the face of so much loss, Mr. Komatsu found a message of mercy that put into words the visual he had experienced years before: the Japanese-language Lutheran Hour radio broadcasts. After all that was lost in the war, after many a prayer for the mercy of God, he came to know, and be grateful, that God's mercy was for him, too.

In the hurricanes, earthquakes, and other disasters of life, Jesus gives us all we need to persevere. This week let's hold on together to the eternal hope we have been given: even when we falter, Jesus remains faithful (2 Tim 2:13)!



First and Second Timothy are two of the most beloved and controversial of Paul's letters, giving us a great opportunity to grow in our faith through a discussionbased study of these two letters. How to pray for our leaders, identifying bad doctrine, what to wear in church, who should serve in church, the love of Christ, baptism, the Word, and even the end times it's all here in Paul's letters to a beginning pastor! Among all of this, it was Paul's desire to instruct and encourage young Timothy to be grounded in the Gospel, setting a good example for all believers in his Gospel ministry.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace

First priority is providing beds for children who are sleeping in compromised situations. That may mean on the floor, on a pile of blankets, or on a couch. A volunteer crew delivered to a family of 3 little girls that had all been sleeping on the same (broken) twin size bed. That same night a bed was delivered to a 17-year-old that had never had a bed of his own.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace provides the bed, mattress, and bedding to each child. Bedlessness is a real problem in the US with 2-3% of the population sleeping without beds. Two questions are asked of the applicants: is the child over 3 and under 18 years, and do they currently not have a bed. Volunteer builds sponsored by local churches, businesses, and individuals have built and delivered more than 60,000 beds in the US.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace provides all the tools and expertise that allow people with little or no experience to build all the components for a solid, wood bunk bed. It is always a fun-filled half day that ends with branding the beds. The fellowship is wonderful and the ability to solve a problem for others leaves everyone feeling a bit better about the world! RLC will be sponsoring a **Sleep in Heavenly Peace Build Day on Saturday**, **November 5** from 9:00 am-1:00 pm in the church parking lot. Mark your calendars! We will need 50 volunteers for the build.
