## Pastor's Corner for October 16-22

## Jesus Is There in the Quiet

(Luke 18:9-17)

Many of our appointed Gospel readings during this year are all about "not losing heart." When you stop to consider some of the national trends that have become news stories in our own city this past week (as I write this, a shooting incident in East Raleigh has taken the lives of five people), is that not an especially timely Word for all of us to put in our pocket and carry around this week?

Jesus knows that when it comes to our hopes and dreams in life... especially with all that is fair and life-giving in our dealings with others at home, at school, on the job, and in our community... it is easy to grow discouraged. He knew that at times even

God Himself appears to be on the opposing side of something His children hold dear and hope for. And so, Jesus tells the story of a widow, the most powerless person in the society of his day, going up against an unjust judge, a man of power and reputation. "If this powerless widow could prevail against such a man, won't God come to your aid and deliver justice even more faithfully?" Jesus says. Sure, it might seem right now like a promise delayed is a promise betrayed. But don't give up! Don't lose heart. Jesus knows what real powerlessness is. All authority on heaven and on earth has been given to the resurrected One, who became powerless and died on a cross. But He now lives. And He might even be using you and me to be agents of change and justice here below.

All of which puts prayer and the quiet spaces of life in the proper perspective. Prayer isn't so much a one-way conversation that, accompanied by the appropriate measure of faith, necessarily gets the results it wants when it wants them. It looks, at times, much more like a wrestling match with God. Just consider the prayers of the Old Testament patriarchs. Especially in the drier seasons of life, prayer can be much closer to an attitude of waiting and hearing only silence. But despite the silence, Jesus, is there in the quiet. Jesus keeps hearts open. Because of Jesus, we don't give up. He hears the yearnings of our heart and takes them to the throne of the Father (Rom 8:34). And all appearances to the contrary, Jesus has and will again deliver what only He knows we and the world we serve need most.

Because of the crucified and risen Lord Jesus Christ, we do keep heart. We keep at this fragile thing called faith. As we gather again this Sunday to celebrate the One who is with us even in the quiet places of life, we receive the power of the One made power-less out of love for us.

## Sunday Morning Adult Christian Ed



First and Second Timothy are two of the most beloved and controversial of Paul's letters, giving us a great opportunity to grow in our faith through a discussionbased study of these two letters. How to pray for our leaders, identifying bad doctrine, what to wear in church, who should serve in church, the love of Christ, baptism, the Word, and even the end times it's all here in Paul's letters to a beginning pastor! Among all of this, it was Paul's desire to instruct and encourage young Timothy to be grounded in the Gospel, setting a good example for all believers in his Gospel ministry.

## Sleep in Heavenly Peace

First priority is providing beds for children who are sleeping in compromised situations. That may mean on the floor, on a pile of blankets, or on a couch. A volunteer crew delivered to a family of 3 little girls that had all been sleeping on the same (broken) twin size bed. That same night a bed was delivered to a 17 -year-old that had never had a bed of his own.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace provides the bed, mattress, and bedding to each child. Bedlessness is a real problem in the US with 2-3\% of the population sleeping without beds. Two questions are asked of the applicants: is the child over 3 and under 18 years, and do they currently not have a bed. Volunteer builds sponsored by local churches, businesses, and individuals have built and delivered more than 60,000 beds in the US.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace provides all the tools and expertise that allow people with little or no experience to build all the components for a solid, wood bunk bed. It is always a fun-filled half day that ends with branding the beds. The fellowship is wonderful and the ability to solve a problem for others leaves everyone feeling a bit better about the world!
