*Pastor's Corner for October 30-November 5*

### **A 21st Century Reformation? (John 8:31, Revelation 14:6)**

The Reformation we celebrate this weekend has to do with the Spirit-led focus of Martin Luther and many of his contemporaries on the gift of God's Word rather than the teachings of popes or pastors apart from God's Word. The first Reformation had to do with SOLA CHRISTUS [Christ alone], and the work of Jesus Christ to take away the sins of the world SOLA GRATIA [by the grace of God, alone]. But that Reformation, gift of the Holy Spirit that it was, took place at a time

when the Church was the ultimate insider group— at least in most of Europe. As it is often said, we live in a post-Christendom age. Now the people of God find themselves navigating the difficulties of life without the comforting cultural structure of the Church to which they (we) had grown accustomed. Some might be tempted to grieve the past. Others will harbor doubts and fears for the future. All might be confused about how to best meet the challenges of the present, wringing hands or circling the proverbial wagons. Jesus, who invites his followers of every age to “abide in my word” (John 8:31) is calling us to something else. John, exiled on the island of Patmos, sees the vision of an angel with an “eternal gospel” to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, “to every nation and tribe and language and people.” Maybe, just maybe —as it became even more important during the indulgence-trafficking days of the 16th century— the invitation to remain in Jesus’ Word and share the gospel with every “nation, tribe, language, and people” is just as important today, now that the props to the Christian faith in familiar places have fallen away. Could this be a time that the Spirit of God is ushering in a 21st Century Reformation?

The privilege of being a part of this movement is joining in on something GOD is at work doing. While the mission of churches throughout the Southeastern District is “connecting people to Jesus,” Resurrection Lutheran Church has a specific way of going that. What a great time to highlight a 3-part mission focus for our congregation that you will be seeing a lot more about in the months and years ahead:

1) **SUPPORTING OUR SCHOOLS:** Resurrection Lutheran School and Resurrection Lutheran Preschool are truly treasures to our church family! We want to support the work of our schools’ staff, teachers, children, and their families through prayer and friendship— to bring the love of Jesus to our school communities by our words and actions.

2) **SERVING ALONGSIDE OUR COMMUNITY:** Our “saved by grace, through faith, for service” mission to the world is at the heart of what we strive to do —by the empowering of the Holy Spirit— at RLC. Let’s focus on inviting folks who love to help others but may not know of God’s love in Christ themselves, to serve together with us! This provides us an opportunity to share the reason for our

service and to welcome them into “the family.”

3) **ENGAGING THE NATIONS:** RLC has been blessed by God not only to support the work of our congregation’s missionaries with our offerings and prayers but to send short-term mission teams overseas where our partner churches’ ministries are open to forming partnerships. Meanwhile, closer to home, the Research Triangle is bringing the world to our doorstep. We have an opportunity to engage the nations of the world that few congregations have! What a privilege to be placed where we are by God for this special opportunity.

This Reformation Sunday we once again give thanks to God for God’s Word and the chance to be used by God on behalf of God’s mission to the world!

### **DCE Call Committee Update**

Members of the call committee (Dan Shaltanis - Chair, Jamee Thieme, Angela York, Jamie Measmer, Scott Ferguson) met on October 13th for their first meeting. After introductions, we discussed our role as committee members, reviewed the DCE position description, discussed the ways to call a DCE, and talked about next steps. The Church Council approved a position description seeking a DCE to focus on

### **Training in Righteousness**

First and Second Timothy are two of the most beloved and controversial of Paul's letters, giving us a great opportunity to grow in our faith through a discussion-based study of these two letters. How to pray for our leaders, identifying bad doctrine, what to wear in church, who should serve in church, the love of Christ, baptism, the Word, and even the end times it's all here in Paul's letters to a beginning pastor! Among all of this, it was Paul's desire to instruct and encourage young Timothy to be grounded in the Gospel, setting a good example for all believers in his Gospel ministry.

### Sleep in Heavenly Peace

First priority is providing beds for children who are sleeping in compromised

situations. That may mean on the floor, on a pile of blankets, or on a couch. A volunteer crew delivered to a family of 3 little girls that had all been sleeping on the same (broken) twin size bed. That same night a bed was delivered to a 17-year-old that had never had a bed of his own.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace provides the bed, mattress, and bedding to each child. Bedlessness is a real problem in the US with 2-3% of the population sleeping without beds. Two questions are asked of the applicants: is the child over 3 and under 18 years, and do they currently not have a bed. Volunteer builds sponsored by local churches, businesses, and individuals have built and delivered more than 60,000 beds in the US.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace provides all the tools and expertise that allow people with little or no experience to build all the components for a solid, wood bunk bed. It is always a fun-filled half day that ends with branding the beds. The fellowship is wonderful and the ability to solve a problem for others leaves everyone feeling a bit better about the world!



We will be hosting our third bunk bed build with Sleep in Heavenly Peace on **Saturday, November 5** in the parking lot outside the Family Life Center starting at 9:00 am. We are building 20 beds for 20 kids with the Fuquay-Varina chapter.

We need 50 volunteers for the build. No experience necessary. All stations are

manned by a trained SHP lead. Sign up to volunteer and let's get 20 more kids off the floor!




