From the Pastor

The Big Picture

(Psalm 104)

Space Shuttle Astronaut Mike Massamino wrote a book a few years ago entitled Spaceman. In it he described what it was like to be involved in a spacewalk. When asked to describe what it was like to do an EVA ("extravehicular activity") he said: "It's very emotional. ... And viewing our planet was so compelling. Words like beautiful and awesome just don't do it justice. I felt that I was looking at a paradise.... I can't imagine any place being more beautiful than our planet and how lucky we are to be able to live here." You sense as you listen to a man talking like this that it's a kind of "words fail me" sort of moment. Why? Not only is the earth our home, and as astronauts often point out, the ONE home of all nations on earth. Not only is the earth a marvelous creation of the God... the earth is



declared by God to be good. The creatures that live and thrive on this terrestrial ball are even used by Jesus as a focus for all who are at times set upon by worries they feel they can never escape. To put it simply, Massamino saw the BIG PICTURE from out

there. Yeah, he had a job to do... to fix the Hubble telescope... to perform a million-dollar job on a billion-dollar instrument. And yes, as he described the experience, he ended up stripping the bolts of a handrail the crew would end up tearing off the Hubble so they could do their job! But in the midst of the stress and expectations that were riding on the line... Massamino saw a BIGGER picture. In the dead empty parts of space, the earth was to him a thing of beauty. A person can't help sweating the little things... the up-close parts of life... but seen in light of the BIG PICTURE that Massamino saw, it's hard not to see how truly blessed we all are. As the psalmist writes, "I will praise

November is the month to look at the big picture of what God has gifted each of us, or as Martin Luther puts it, not only has God the Father created the beautiful world and all creatures, He has also given me "my body and soul, eyes, ears and all my members, my reason and all my senses... clothing, shoes, food and drink, house and home..." In the area of our financial gifts, which are also gifts from God's hand, we once again encourage one another to consider what portion of the blessings God has entrusted to us that we can dedicate toward kingdom work here at RLC. I invite you to consider submitting a pledge in worship services over the weekends of November 12/13 and 19/20 using one of the pledge cards you can pick up at church. Pledges are made anonymously and are simply a way to say "thank you" to God for His good gifts this past year while recommitting ourselves again to a life of active stewardship in 2023. You can also make a pledge electronically through links made available through our church website and in our weekly announcements.

This year I'd also like to take a moment to alert you to another way you can dedicate offerings to the mission of the church: through Resurrection Lutheran Church Endowment. This endowment, together with a similar endowment set up for Resurrection Lutheran School, has been established through the Lutheran Legacy Foundation, organization that assists LCMS churches in making the most of the funds entrusted to them on behalf of God's kingdom work. LLF will match the first \$500,000 deposited into the RLC Endowment by 20%. Interest and dividends from the memorials and other gifts earmarked for the RLC Endowment will be used....

- To help other LCMS churches as they are getting started
- To respond to national or international needs or disasters
- For community needs in Wake County
- To provide for the specific financial needs of individual members of RLC who find themselves in extraordinary circumstances
- To provide scholarships for individuals studying at an LCMS seminary or college preparing for other church ministry vocations
- To support national or international missionary efforts

(Applications for specific financial disbursements can be made through the church office and submitted to the Church Council for review.)

RLC has been richly blessed by God, and we have a generous congregation. It is a privilege to be used by God to serve our community. Doing so, we say "thank you!" for all that God has done for each of us. Whether our offerings to God are big or small is not the point. Rather, seeing the big picture of all that has been gifted to us, we do what God allows us to do on behalf of the greater good.

Outreach to the Community

Christmas Store

There are many families who do not have adequate resources to purchase gifts for their children at Christmas time. They find themselves struggling just to make ends meet for the necessities of life. Following instructions of Jesus, the Christmas Store is designed to help families in the towns and cities of southern Wake County who are in need during the holidays.

Families are referred to the Christmas Store by Western Wake Crisis Ministry, Dorcas Ministries, Fuquay-Varina Emergency Food Pantry, and Holly Springs Food Cupboard. Throughout the year, these organizations work with people who are in crisis situations resulting from a lack of resources. They refer clients with children 14 years of age or younger to register for the Christmas Store. School counselors from local schools also refer families whom they know to be in need during the holiday season to register for the Christmas Store.

Once items are received and ready, clients are able to "shop" for 3 gifts for each child registered. So let's help stock the Christmas Store! Here at Resurrection Lutheran Church, we place Christmas trees with gift tags



in the Narthex and Family Life Center. Please pick up a tag (or two!), purchase the items, then place the <u>unwrapped</u> toy with tag attached back under the tree.

Another way to help is by purchasing toys online at your favorite retailer and have them delivered directly to United Church, 820 East Williams St., Apex NC 27502.




