Pastor's Corner for December 18-24

God's Answer to the World's Dread (Isaiah 7:10-17)

The promise was made flesh and dwelt among us. This is the week that we turn the corner a bit from a focus on the prayer "Come Lord Jesus!" and the encouraging greeting "The Lord be with you!" to a focus on the promise fulfilled: The Lord IS with you. Jesus IS God with us!

Ahaz is the king appearing in our Old Testament reading this Sunday. Isaiah brings a Word of God to encourage the king. If only Ahaz would listen! But Ahaz is a king experiencing dread. He is worried about the ruler of Israel and the ruler of Aram

who have formed an alliance and are preparing to attack him. "Be careful, be quiet, do not fear, do not let your heart grow faint," Isaiah says to him (7:4). God's GOT this, Isaiah promises! And to comfort the king further, Ahaz is asked to name a sign so that God can actually demonstrate faithfulness to the king in a tangible way (7:10). But Ahaz answered his dread not with the peace of putting his trust in GOD's plan but with the busy-ness of putting his OWN plans in place! Isaiah promises Ahaz this will not go well. But the sign of God's faithfulness is promised anyway: "The virgin will conceive and bear a son and shall call His name 'Immanuel' (God with us)."

Dread appears to be a trending topic these days. Whether it's the possibility of a global recession, the impacts felt by a "tripledemic," personal or family crises— or just the gloomy cold weather and the long dark days— there are plenty of reasons we might feel both the need to get our plans in place and the inadequacy of doing that well. We will always have work to get done and something to be concerned about. But once again this year, whether we are looking for a sign or not, God gives us one: The virgin has conceived and born a Son. This Son is God's answer to the world's dread. Our sins are forgiven. The living Spirit of God dwells within us. We end the year at rest and at peace, with the confidence to trust not in ourselves but in the assurance of God's love for us and the truth that God always keeps His promises.

The Lord IS with us. Jesus—God with us—is born.


Special Voters' Meeting on January 8 at 12:30 PM


