Pastor's Corner for December 25-31

God's Sign Language for a New Year (Isaiah 52:7-10)

Japan Lutheran College in Tokyo, Japan, where I once served as Associate Professor of New Testament Studies, became the first university in Japan to ever enroll a full-time student born completely sight and hearing impaired. I remember the first time I encountered this young man, Mr. Atsushi Mori. I was intrigued by the way he communicated with the world. Because he was unable to see ordinary sign language, it was necessary for him to have an interpreter sign words directly into his hand. This way he could literally "touch" what was being said. He also had an important gadget that he took everywhere he went. A small machine, about as large as a small tablet computer, would translate printed matter into a refreshable braille display, a small pad on his computer containing moveable pins that would allow him to feel the braille rendering of words that he was unable to see or hear. Of course, technology alone was unable to provide everything Mr. Mori needed in the way of a user-friendly experience at the college. But those who had opportunity to work with him soon learned that with some adjustments it was possible not only to communicate with him... but to work with him as he prepared to be an advocate for the deaf-blind community in Japan, the vocation to which he had been called.

One reason Jesus Christ was born was so that God might have a new way to communicate to a world that could not have otherwise understood or received Him. We know our faith is founded upon the Word of God. The Word of God brings Life. The Scriptures record how God brought forth the created world out of nothing but words. "Let there be life!" God said it, and it was so. Yet in the broad sweep of salvation history, humankind was not left to live by mere words alone. The prophet Isaiah speaks on Christmas Day about those who would proclaim "good news" regarding God's reign (7). This good news about the reign of God was applied by St. Paul to none other than Jesus Christ Himself (Rom 10:14-17). Jesus--God's own dear Son, the Word made flesh, would not only speak God's Word, He would also be born and live as God's "sign language" to a broken and dying world. That sign language started in a manger in Bethlehem... but it didn't end there! It vividly depicted the picture of God's love poured out through a dying, crucified man on the first Good Friday. It felt strangely alive through a stone-cold tomb that stood open and empty on the first Easter morning. That's why the manger and the resurrection cross align in our church sanctuary— the first thing we see as we gather there on Christmas day! And the Word made flesh still comes to us in the lives of flesh-and-blood people, even when we feel we can't see or hear or sense God stirring at all. Through the miracle of the first Christmas, we find Life – or perhaps we had better say, Life has found us. That is what keeps Christmas special not only on December 25... but all the way through 2023 and beyond.

My prayer for all of us as we turn the page of the calendar from 2022 to 2023 is that we might not only enjoy a safe and meaningful Christmas... but a Life-filled

New Year, too. Join us again as we gather at the manger in the weeks ahead, giving thanks to God together, for what Life (because of Jesus!) has in store.
