Pastor's Corner for January 1-7

Reality Check (Matthew 2:13-23)

Christmas Day has come and gone. We have a new year... a new opportunity to begin another chapter of life! If you're like millions of Americans, you might be in the midst of a reality check. Maybe it's the bills coming due for presents that were purchased to create "the dream Christmas" for someone. Or maybe it's the beautiful new tech gadget you got that doesn't live up to the hype. Or maybe it's the salt and sludge all over your car after driving out of town and through (what seemed like it, at the time) a Winter Wonderland. Or maybe it's being back in the office after a killer vacation. That empty space in your living room where the tree used to be... is now just a pile of needles! We are still in the season of Christmas... at least until January 6. But whatever magic and warmth the holiday might have had wears off— sooner or later— and we're all left with life back in the "real world" again. The story of Herod and the young boys Herod put to death in our text for today is a more vivid kind of reality check. Sure, there was much about the birth of Jesus for Mary to treasure in her heart (Luke 2:19). Yes, the vision of angels in the night sky singing "Glory to God in the Highest" seems an almost magical portent of God's peace unfolding on earth. The image of shepherds bending the knee at the manger inside the Christmas crèche reminds us of the love of God poured out on the humble outsider. But the reality of the situation was that Jesus, King that he was, was born into a world of power politics. The hard truth is that God's Son came into a broken, violent, and dangerous world. It would be nice to take a little time at the crèche with the baby Jesus, Mary, Joseph, the shepherds and the sheep. We don't want to hear the angel hovering above the nativity coming down from his perch, taking Joseph aside and whispering in his ear, "Listen, you guys have to get out of here." But Herod and the power politics of Jesus' day make a reality check necessary. Sin is the real-world problem that does the same today.

Maybe on the first day of 2023 a reality check from the God who calls his own out of Egypt (Matt 2:15) is just what we need to ready us for what is around the corner. The coast is never really "clear." Yet despite the darkness that is in the world, there is no need to stay in hiding for those who look to the right arm of the Lord to win the battle over the Enemy. The same God that rescued Israel from their taskmasters in Egypt called Jesus and his family out of Egypt. That didn't mean that Israel or Jesus would have it easy. But just as God turned Pharaoh and Herod into unwitting participants in the course of salvation history, he turns suffering and despair today into a display of His glory and strength tomorrow. That's the REAL reality! That's our confidence again in this new year, as our God of mercy goes with us.






Mark Parsons Vice President Truth in Love Ministry
