
The Baptism of Our Lord January 8, 2023



Pastor's Corner for January 8-14

It Works! (Matthew 3:13-17; Romans 6:1-11)

This weekend we read and think about Jesus' baptism. While Jesus' baptism was an important event all by itself, it's impossible to think about it and give thanks to God for the love that went into it without also giving thanks to God for the baptism each one of us receives. In our baptism God claims us as His own— all because of what Jesus started in Jordan's River and completed on Calvary's cross.

What exactly did Jesus start on the day of His baptism? You get a sense of it in John's confusion over why Jesus should come to him to be baptized. Jesus had no sin. Unlike all the others coming to be baptized by John, Jesus had nothing to confess. There was no obvious reason for Him to get His feet muddy or His clothes soaked in the Jordan River. When Jesus approached John like all the others, you can understand why John would clarify: "I need to be baptized by You... and do You come to me?" Yet Jesus' answer said it all: "Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Or as The Message has it, "Do it. God's work, putting things right all these centuries, is coming together right now in this baptism." Jesus' baptism was the beginning of God's work of putting everything right... it was how God started to get a broken world to "work" as He had originally intended.

OUR baptisms, by contrast, are the means for the God who gets a broken world to work through Christ to be at work in each of us! St. Paul writes: "All of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death. Therefore, we were buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life." Those who remember American theologian Joseph Sittler say he used to talk about a time he was in Jerusalem and his car broke down. Naturally, he took his car to a mechanic there to have it fixed. When the mechanic had finished and started up the engine to hear it running perfectly, he said, "Tzadik!" "Tzadik" (צד'ק) is the Hebrew word in the Bible often translated as "(It is) righteous." In the context of the broken car, the word means simply: "it works!"

At the beginning of this new year, this new week, and even any new day throughout this year, knowing we are renewed in Christ Jesus and in Him are made "to work" is a great way to live. Thank heaven that no matter what tomorrow may bring, by the gift of our baptism we "walk in NEWNESS of life"!



Sanctity of Life

We, Resurrection Lutheran Church, observe the sanctity of life every day. However, January is the month we place more emphasis on it in order to remind ourselves and others of the significance of life. By life we mean all stages of life. We are concerned about poverty, hunger, suicide, euthanasia, abortion; as all these and many others impact our lives and the lives of those around us. Scripture tells us how precious life is and we are instructed to nurture it.

We, as a Church, do many things to promote the sanctity of life, whether it be building bunk beds, providing needed support through the Love Fund, Stephen Ministry, reaching out through the Coffeehouse, Blind Ministry, Middle School Mission Ministry, and in so many other ways. Annually we conduct a fundraiser for Gateway Women's Care via a baby bottle campaign. Gateway Women's Care is a local pregnancy resource ministry offering compassion, hope, and non-judgmental help to women and men facing unplanned pregnancy. This free support enables those considering abortion to make informed decisions and to know there are realistic alternatives.

Gateway also offers post abortive care and education for women and men suffering from a past abortion. Many of Gateway's volunteers and staff are post abortive and want to help others in this situation. Gateway is a Christ-centered ministry and shares the Gospel with those clients who want to receive it.

We will share more about what Gateway provides as we get closer to the start date of our baby bottle fundraiser, which will be Sanctity of Life weekend, January 21/22.
