



Council Corner

We started our monthly meeting by celebrating this month's highlights featured below. In addition, we finalized a new WHY Statement and have identified steps on how to purposefully incorporate our Why in all that we do at Resurrection. Look for details forthcoming in a separate article. In addition, the Council reflected on the overall spirit of our congregation, especially evident in the sharing and fellowship during the Our Way Home Adult Education Bible Study. We are grateful for the volunteers who have stepped forward to help in new program areas. A major highlight was the installation of our new Vicar, Alan Shaw.

Additional Highlights:

1. Membership Update – We looked more deeply into those who have moved out of town and have not attended church in a period of time. Of particular interest, are those who have joined the church in the last 3-5 years. This group will be the primary focus of our Shepherding Team.
2. Our Church ran a deficit in January, approximately \$13k. However, we continue to be in a strong financial position, with the need to look at both our projected income and non-essential spending. A special Finance Subcommittee will be meeting to review options and report back to the Council in March.
3. As part of our on-going financial analysis, the Next 40 Team will be asked to provide an update on expected giving at this time versus actual.
4. Council approved financially supporting/funding the National Youth Gathering as required, noting that there are several fundraisers being planned to help cover the current trip shortfall.
5. The Council reviewed the updated Endowment Fund process and current fund status. We currently have several projects that could be funded through our various Endowments, including Safe Families and Alan Shaw's initial SMP costs. Also, we will be reviewing many of the major maintenance expenses for the last year to see what can be covered by our Maintenance Reserve Endowment Fund.
6. Council approved the final Governance Manual language related to calling a Senior Pastor, removing the former requirement to have two Council members on the Senior Pastor Call Committee and replacing it with a role that works with Call Committee to help define key candidate requirements.
7. Council will continue to look for ways to enhance member engagement and involvement. Several actions are being considered and will be further developed.
8. Two of our newly formed teams, including Video Streaming and new visitor-based website video, have met and are making progress. We are also in the early stages of forming an IT/Technology Team.
9. Council is going to look at the major fundraising event calendar and see how we can better coordinate actions with key program activities. More to follow on this.
10. We discussed a growing concern among some members regarding church security. As a precautionary step, we will start by looking to local law enforcement for any initial recommendations.





Congratulations to Alan Shaw, our new Vicar!



Alan, who has already been very busy in ministry to us, has now entered the 4 Year Specific Ministry Pastor (SMP) program at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis. The SMP program in the LCMS is designed for men who have potential for ministry in a Specific Congregation to form them into the pastoral role for that congregation. Alan's Specific Ministry is congregational coaching and leadership development, which he is doing with Sunday School and individual or group coaching settings, but the program allows him to also fill many of the general ministry roles for the church.

As a seminarian who is officially serving a congregation prior to his ordination, Alan will serve as our Vicar under the supervision of our Circuit Visitor, Rev. Mike Merker. Alan will be expanding his roles in ministry here at Resurrection and is officially authorized to consecrate Holy Communion, preach upon occasion, baptize, conduct funerals or weddings, and practice all of the various roles that a Pastor in the LCMS would perform here at Resurrection.


