

Council Corner

Per its normal practice, the Council did not meet in July. We do, however want to share several items as follows:

- 1. Final Budget Year Financials June was a positive month for RLC, generating income of approximately \$3,000 and \$8,000 for the year. As part of closing the books for the year, we completed our 10% tithe commitment by making the following contributions:
 - Increased our monthly PLM donation to \$2,500
 - Allocated \$4,000 for the upcoming Lutheran Habitat Build, which is higher than last year's contribution. We will be looking to see if more funds can be added later this year
 - Contributed \$1,200 each to the Western Wake Crisis Ministries, Christ Community in Action, Lutheran World Relief, and completed our annual \$1,500 commitment to RLC Coffeehouse
- 2. We are putting our interview plan together for the upcoming Senior Pastor visits. Each Council member is developing a series of questions.

Call Committee Update

We have sad news to share with the congregation. Pastor Morris, along with his wife and daughter, were in a car accident last week. They are all okay, but Pastor Morris was severely injured and will need time to heal. He will not be able to visit in August as planned. Please keep Pastor Morris and his family in your prayers. The Call Committee proposes to move forward with the inperson visits and Call Service with Pastors Adle and Blanke.

- Three candidates have accepted our invitation for an in-person visit. Since Pastor Morris is unable to visit at this time, we will only have two in-person visits (Pastors Adle and Blanke).
- During the in-person visits, the candidates will meet with the Call Committee, Council, staff, and the congregation. A summary of the schedules is listed on the previous page.




