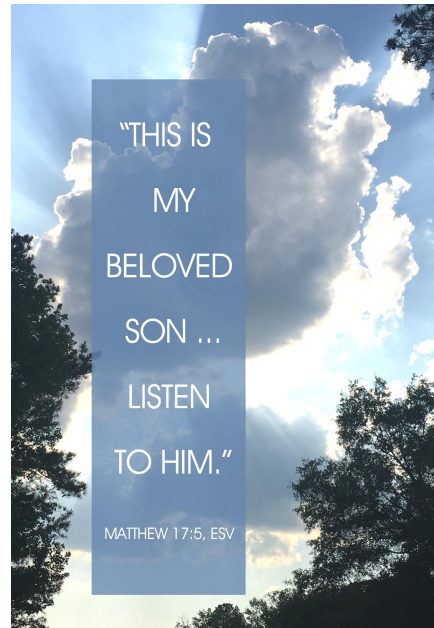

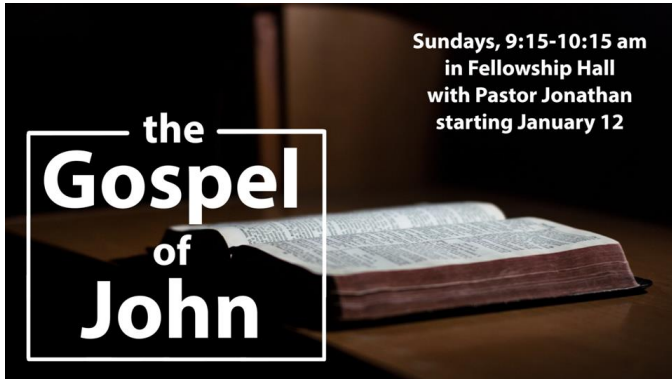

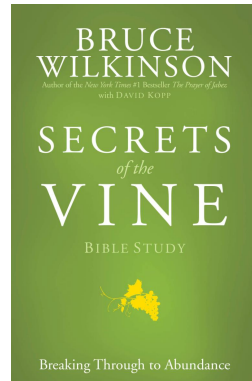
Secrets of the Vine February 19-April 15

This ministry seeks to teach the faith, witness through the power of faithful staff, and reach into the community. "Reach 100" program seeks to bring 100 children each summer to a week of faith based Christian camp, totally free of charge. Often these children are homeless or in severe financial need. Agapé has partnered through "Reach 100" with congregations, social service groups, schools, and congregations to offer great summer camp experiences. In 2019, this ministry served over 13,000 guests. Our focus is on a small-group style that stresses the importance of building relationships with God, with other people, and with God's creation. 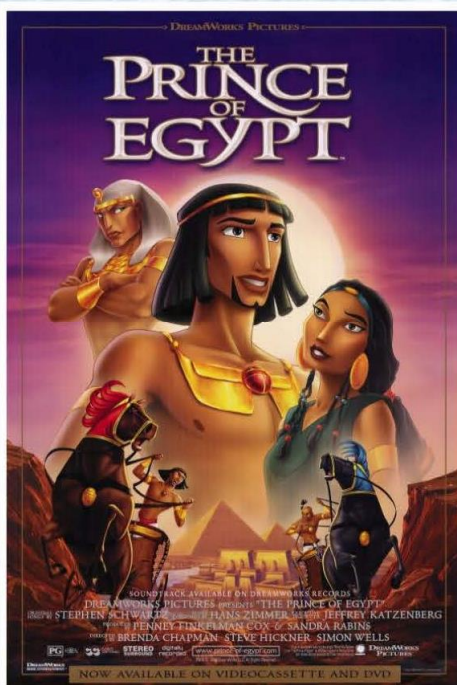

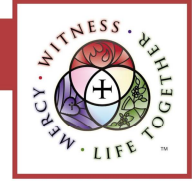
