

In the Gospel of Matthew, we find Satan challenging Jesus' Identity. Immediately after Jesus is baptized. where the Voice of God the Father identifies Iesus as His Son, Jesus is led into the wilderness. There, Satan tempts Jesus to prove His Identity as the Son of God. Jesus does not fall for the devil's identity-challenging scheme. Later, outside of Jerusalem, however, Jesus will show that He really is the Son of God as He dies

on the cross for the sins of the world, carrying out His Identity and Mission as God's Son. The Lord drives people to the wilderness and tests us, so that we may learn that His Grace is always sufficient. He reestablishes our "sonship" in those wilderness journeys. Through our struggle we learn that He is Faithful, Dependable, Trustworthy, and Loving.

We will use the format of worship known as TAIZE for Saturday's evening service at 6:00 pm.



This format includes a darkened setting of the worship space with more candles, the singing of short ostinato refrains of Biblical and liturgical phrases, periods of quiet for reflection, the celebration of communion, readings, and sermon.



Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a national organization whose sole mission is to build beds for kids who do not have beds to sleep in. Last year during SHP's Bunks Across America build, RLC partnered with SHP's newly-established Durham Chapter, to build, deliver and assemble 24 beds for children in the Raleigh/Durham area whose families did not have the means to provide a bed for them. Not only did children in our area receive a bed (often their first!), but they also received a mattress, linens, pillow, a beautifully handcrafted quilt created by our RLC Quilters, and a "sweet dreams" bag created by our youth containing age-appropriate goodies such as books, stuffed animals and other items.

SHP's Durham Chapter currently has more than 300+ requests for beds! Not having a bed to sleep in is just not something many of us think about, but the need is great - across America and right here in our backyard. RLC will partner with SHP Durham once again on June 20, 2020 for a Bunk Build to provide even more children with a bed of their very own thus allowing them to achieve much needed restorative sleep.

Your support today will help us purchase the raw materials for the bunks and bed linens!

Revelation will be the subject for the LifeLight Bible Study from Wednesday, March 18 through Wednesday, May 20.

RLC Piecemakers Quilt Group

We have been inspired to call ourselves, *The Piecemakers*. Hopefully, all the quilts we make will bring God's peace, love, and joy to those who receive them! Currently, we are working on making 48 quilts to go with the Sleep in Heavenly Peace Bunk Bed Build that RLC will be hosting in June. Then we will continue to make quilts for Lutheran World Relief who will send them all around the world to those who need them.

We now **meet every Tuesday from 11:30 am-3:00 pm in Room 151** and will start meeting every third Saturday from 9:00 am-1:00 pm in Room 151 starting on March 21. Feel free to drop in any time during those hours! We can use help sorting and matching fabric, sewing and ironing quilt tops, putting together the layers of the quilts, and tying the quilts. At anytime you may use the keys on the left side of the cabinets to go in the rightmost cabinet and get a pack of matching fabric or whatever you need. With this or your own cotton fabric, simply sew a quilt top that is 60 inches by 80 inches. You can use 12 inch squares in a 5 by 7 pattern or create your own. We can always use donated fabric and bed sheets for the backs of the quilts.
