### Council Corner – March 2020 Meeting

Our meeting devotion focused on staying in God's presence and trusting in Him, especially as we, as a church family deal, with the Coronavirus. The health and safety of our members is our top priority. A number of steps have been taken and we will continue to communicate updates, through as many means as possible.

1. We were joined by Ross Bowen and Ashleigh Buser from our Senior High Youth Group.
2. February was a good month from a receipt perspective, totally \$120,000, which was much higher than our January receipts of \$87,000. Operating expenditures were normal. YTD we are operating at a positive \$7,000 position.
3. Council is working to develop an initial budget expense draft for the April meeting. We are keeping our expenses tight, which will hopefully help us identify some initial funding for an Associate Pastor.
4. We continue to see a small YTD increase in attendance versus the same 2018 period, averaging about 3.5%. Given the recent trend in Cary, with checks being taken from church mailboxes, we are installing a locking mailbox.
5. We are continuing to identify the approved security cameras that will be in use on all entrances to the church. The Church Security Team visited Hope Community Church to learn their Safety and Security systems.
6. Pastor Jonathan updated the Council on our current Coronavirus actions and noted some new potential items, like videotaping a sanctuary service and have it available on the website. Pastor reported that 40 new members attended the recent "Welcome to Resurrection" event. He is continuing to work with RLS and RLP Staff and Board members to help discover additional collaboration opportunities.
7. An update to the Service Change Taskforce was provided. Second session scheduled for March 21. One big challenge will be to discern the impact of any change on our Youth and Adult Sunday School programs.
8. Council approved 4 Endowment Funding requests, including Alan Shaw's SMP, tuition assistance for RLS, and partial funding for Safe Families and Sleep in Heavenly Peace. The last two items augment budgeted operating funding.
9. Council endorsed looking into an amendment to change Service Terms from 2 to 3 years. The basic premise is to reduce the amount of biannual turnover.
10. Over the past several months, the Council has begun looking at some current (now), near-term (1-2 years, and longer term goals (2-5 years). An input summary was compiled and each Council member provided their respective priority. This input was categorized into three areas based on their input. The three highest priority goals were getting an Associate Pastor (1-2 years), One Church Unity/Focus (Now), and Improving our Sunday School Attendance – Youth and Adult (1-2 Years). We reviewed each one in detail and will be identifying possible programs that may need 2020-21 budget funding.
  - For the Associate Pastor position, Pastor Jonathan provided an initial outline of the qualifications he would like in an Associate Pastor. This information will be shared with the congregation during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter. Current thinking is that this position will be filled sometime in 2021.
  - In reviewing possible actions/programs for the One Church Unity/Focus, a large number of ideas were generated. Most centered on the concept of "Community of Believers" and coming together in a variety of ways.
  - For the Adult and Youth Sunday School program, several key ideas were generated, including asking members/parents what type of classes/topics would be desired. One possible common adult theme is "How do we live as Christians in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century".

The next action for these three goals will be to develop some specific action items/timing.

11. Next month the Council will start to review the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest priority group, which totals eight items.


